



## Mt. Washington Auto Road adds new 3-hour guided tours

Pinkham Notch, NH - The Mt.
Washington Auto Road has expanded
guided tour options with a 3-hour version
offering guests additional ways to explore
Mount Washington. The Auto Road will
now offer 2- and 3-hour versions of their
guided tours allowing guests to spend
more time exploring scenic areas along the
Road as well the option to spend more time
on the summit of the highest peak in the
Northeast.

The newly-added, 3-hour guided tours are meant to provide guests the opportunity to explore the Auto Road anywhere from the base at Great Glen Trails to the summit of Mount Washington.

Where current 2-hour tours are spent mostly on the summit, the 3-hour tour provides opportunities to stop and explore more of the opportunities along the Road itself - or to spend additional time on the summit.

"There's so much to see and do along the way to the summit", explains Dan Houde, Marketing Director at the Auto Road and Great Glen Trails. "Everyone knows that the summit is exciting no matter what the weather may be, but there are countless opportunities for adventure along the way. Guests who choose to drive their own vehicles can spend the entire day



exploring the pull-offs, short hikes, alpine flowers and vistas, but with one of our knowledgeable guides leading the way, you can learn so much more and discover some of the hidden gems along the Auto Road." The 3-hour extended guided tours are available most days (weather permitting) throughout the regular season at 9 a.m and 1 p.m with at least 24 hours of advance reservation. Two adults or children are \$60 per person, while groups of 3 to 4 persons are \$55 per person and 5 or more are just \$50 per person. The best way to book an extended 3-hour tour is to call the Auto Road staff at (603) 466-3988.

Regular 2-hour tours are available without

reservation from 8:30 a.m. - 5 p.m. each day (weather permitting) and run on a first-come, first-served basis. Departures are usually within 30 minutes of purchasing your tickets. Pricing is \$35 for adults, \$30 for seniors (62+) and children ages 5-12 are just \$15. Children ages 4 and under are free. Regular 2-hour tours can also be reserved online 24 hours in advance for the 9:00 a.m. tour for \$5 off per person.

Guided tours of the paddling variety are also available at Great Glen Trails located at the base of the Mt. Washington Auto Road. Guests can enjoy a guided kayak trip along scenic lakes and rivers of northern NH away from the crowds

with brilliant mountain views and opportunities for wildlife viewing.

First opened in 1861, the Mt. Washington Auto Road is America's original and oldest man-made attraction. At nearly 8 miles long, it stretches to the summit of Mt. Washington at 6,288 feet, the highest peak in the Northeast.

## Waterville Valley offers challenge: Climb five mountains in a weekend

Waterville Valley, NH — With more than a dozen 4,000-foot peaks surrounding Waterville Valley, New Hampshire contestants are being asked to climb five of them in a single weekend in a fun hiking challenge. This is Waterville Valley's 5 Summit Challenge, a 20,000-foot total that is almost the height of the highest point in the U.S., Alaska's Mount Denali.

The event, nicknamed "The Denali Challenge" will be held August 14-16 at the resort in the middle of the White Mountain National Forest.

Waterville Valley's proximity to some of New England's highest peaks makes it a great location. Participants in the 5 Summit Challenge will hike (or attempt to hike) five peaks. There will be a choice of 13 mountains to climb and the five peaks chosen must equal 20,000' or higher.

## **Wyman Tavern Brew Fest** in Keene on August 8th

History meets craft brewing on August 8th at the Wyman Tavern Brew Fest. The event will feature fifteen brewers from New Hampshire, Vermont, Maine, and Massachusetts. It will take place on the grounds of the historic Wyman Tavern Museum on Main Street in Keene.

The names of many of the beers bring to mind the region's cultural heritage.



Alsteadder Ale comes from the Belgian Mare Brewery in Alstead, NH. Mountain View Brew comes from Mooselick Brewing Company in Troy, NH. Whipple's Wheat by Henniker Brewing Company is named after a New Hampshire signer of the Declaration of Independence and Samuel Adams is named after a Founding Father from Massachusetts. 4,000 Footer IPA from Woodstock Inn Brewery, East Intervale IPA from Moat Mountain Brewery, and Waterville Wheat from 603 Brewery all celebrate New Hampshire locales.

Proceeds from the Wyman Tavern Brew Fest will benefit the Historical Society of Cheshire County, an organization which has been collecting, preserving, and sharing the history of the Monadnock region since 1927. The Historical Society puts on about 140 programs per year such as exhibits, living history festivals, summer camps, teacher workshops, school visits, films, lectures, and field trips. The most important artifact of the Historical Society is the Wyman Tavern, built in 1762, which the Society operates as a period house museum.

Alan Rumrill, the director of the Historical Society of Cheshire County, said, "A Brew Fest seems like a good fit for the Historical Society of Cheshire County. Beer and ales surely flowed in the Wyman Tavern's Tap Room in the 1700's, and today craft brewers are reviving the old ways of brewing."

Tim Roettiger is one of the brewers who will be sampling his ales at the Wyman Tavern Brew Fest. His brewery is named after the Belgian mare that can be seen outside his home in Alstead, New Hampshire. The basis for the design of Roettiger's brewery is a gravity-fed process that goes back to Medieval tower breweries. Roettiger said, "Belgian Mare is a very traditional bottle-conditioned beer, which is new to most people. Bottle conditioning involves less control and more art. The last fermentation happens inside the bottle, which provides carbonation and the last bit of flavor."

David Morse will be representing one of the region's newest brewing companies -- Mooselick Brewing from Troy, New Hampshire. Morse brews traditional styles of beer such as mild ales and hoppy beers as well as beers with local fruit added. The fruit is fermented to dryness with a tart flavor and a little sweetness. Morse recalled how Mooselick got its start, "My wife Donna and I ran into the owners of Monadnock




Berries, Anthony and Fenella Levick, at a microbrewery in Naples Florida. The idea of brewing beer using fresh farm fruit was hatched serendipitously 1,600 miles away from New Hampshire."

The Wyman Tavern Brew Fest will get underway at 1 pm on August 8th and visitors will be able to sample the brews until 5 pm. ## **Moss & Mushrooms in Home Lawns**

Many lawns in New Hampshire contain moss and/or algae. Moss is often found growing in shady spots in acidic, infertile, poorly-drained soils. Although mosses don't directly damage lawn grasses, they do compete for space and over time can dominate sections of a lawn. Mosses are small green pants that have a mass of fine stems and shallow roots. Generally, moss cannot invade a vigorous, healthy lawn. Any attempts to control moss will be only temporary unless the basic conditions (shade, poor drainage, acid soil) that allowed moss to grow in the first place have been corrected.

Some homeowners discover that mosses make a very attractive ground, maintenance-free ground cover in the areas they are well adapted for. However, if you want to control moss on your lawn, try some of these suggestions:

#### **Non-Chemical Control**

 Maintain good soil fertility and pH values that favor dense, vigorous turf growth. Have the soil tested to determine lime and fertilizer needs. Liming alone isn't

recommended as a short-term control measure.

- Physically remove small patches of moss with a flat edge shovel.
- Improve drainage. If necessary, correct wet conditions using tile drainage.
- Increase light penetration and air circulation. Trim low-branched trees for better light penetration and air movement. You may find it necessary to remove the least desirable trees.
- Use a shade-tolerant grass such as fine-leaf fescues. However, if direct sunlight doesn't reach the ground during the day, plant a ground cover instead of grass.
- Cultivate compacted soils. Reduce compaction by aerating soil with a machine that removes plugs of soil. Improve drainage in fine-textured soils by cultivating and adding large amounts of organic matter and sand.
- Avoid excessive irrigation. Shaded areas where moss usually predominates require less watering than sunny locations.

#### **Chemical Control**

The following products will help control moss: Copper sulfate—Apply at the rate of 3 to 5 ounces per 1,000 square feet, or use a copper fungicide according to label recommendations.

Ferrous sulfate—Apply iron sulfate at the rate of 2 to 3 ounces in 5 gallons of water per 1,000 square feet

#### Mushrooms

Mushrooms (some of which may also be called toadstools or puffballs) live on organic matter in the soil. The mushroom is the above-ground reproductive structure of a fungus. In wet weather mushrooms will often sprout overnigh. Most mushrooms don't damage the lawn but may people find them unsightly. There is no practical or permanent way to eliminate mushrooms. However, the easiest temporary solution is simply to mow them off. Annual de-thatching to reduce the organic matter buildup also helps. When possible, remove any buried roots, stumps and lumber that mushrooms might live on.

## Two UNH NHAES farms offering tours on 2nd Annual Durham Farm Day Aug. 16

The public is invited to tour two University of New Hampshire farms — the Woodman Horticultural Research Farm and the Fairchild Dairy Teaching and Research Center — on the 2nd annual Durham Farm Day Saturday, Aug. 16, 2014. All tours are free. The Woodman Horticultural Research Farm is one of the two horticultural farms that are part of the NH Agricultural Experiment Station at the UNH College of Life Sciences and Agriculture (COLSA). Located at 70 Spinney Lane, the primary activities of this approximately 155-acre farm are research, teaching, and outreach on the production of horticultural and ornamental crops. Research projects include efforts in the areas of integrated pest management and reducing dependence on pesticides, use of high tunnels to hasten and extend the growing season for strawberries, use of reflective plastic mulches to increase tomato yields, development of hull-less pumpkin seeds as a healthy snack food, and the feasibility of growing various shrubs to serve multiple niche markets.

The wooded portion of the farm is used for research and teaching in forestry, wildlife biology, entomology, and water quality. It also contains the equestrian cross country course. The farm hosts many visitors each year, and it is a frequent site of outreach programs for UNH's agricultural initiatives. UNH Cooperative Extension uses the farm for outreach programs to put information into the hands of growers as quickly as possible.

Woodman Farm will be open for public tours from 2 to 4 p.m.; preregistration is required. Please sign up for farm tours by Aug. 14 with Theresa Walker of the Durham Agricultural Commission at theresawalker@comcast.net or 603-659-7226. Map: http://www.colsa.unh.edu/aes/directions/Woodman.

The Fairchild Dairy Teaching and Research Center is one of the NH Agricultural Experiment Station's two dairy farms. It houses 87 milking-age cows and approximately 70 growing, replacement animals. Included in that number

is the 20-cow, student-managed Cooperative for Real Education in Agricultural Management (CREAM) herd, with the remaining animals devoted primarily to dairy nutrition and reproductive biology research. Milk production averages about 26,000 to 27,000 pounds per cow per year, which is greater than the national average of about 22,000 pounds per cow per year.

In 2013 and 2012, the Fairchild Dairy received a Gold Quality award from the Dairy Farmers of America. In 1999, the farm was cited as a Dairy of Distinction by the Milk Sanitation Board, which in 2000 awarded it a Certificate of Quality. In 1997, the CREAM herd was recognized for having the highest quality milk (lowest somatic cell count) from among approximately 3,100 dairy herds on the officialNortheast Dairy Herd Improvement Association test.






Nationally-recognized painter Charlotte Wharton will discuss the relationship between nature and art in her presentation "The Sense of Nature." Wharton's presentation will explore how artists interpret the rhythms of nature to further their own voice.

Charlotte Wharton, from Worcester, is the author of The Language of Energy in Art: Finding Your Vision. She teaches Plein Air landscape workshops at locations such as Tower Hill Botanical Gardens, St. Joseph's Abbey, and Brookfield Orchards in Massachusetts. Her over 600 portraits and landscapes are in National and European collections and she has garnered over five dozen major awards including the Copley Society of Boston's Gold Medal, the Award for Excellence in Portraiture, and the Oil Painters of America Award for Excellence in Painting.

Regarding her process of painting, Wharton said, "I usually name my painting before I begin or while I am painting. Doing so, hopefully, marries the awareness of what I am seeing, responding to, and where I would like the painting to go with getting out of my own way and just letting the painting happen." Two of Wharton's paintings — winter scenes from Jaffrey and Rindge — are currently on display at the Historical Society's Treasured Places exhibit, which showcases conservation lands of the Monadnock Region through the eyes of over fifty regional artists.

Several other events will take place in conjunction with the Historical Society's Treasured Places exhibit. On August 19th the Historical Society will host a presentation on "The Bald Eagle Recovery in New Hampshire" by Chris Martin of New



Hampshire Audubon. On August 26th the Historical Society's executive director Alan Rumrill will provide a look at why the Monadnock region is home to so many conservation properties. On September 2nd Dave Anderson of the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests will present on "A Century of

Statewide Land Conservation."


