The Hillsboro-Deering School Board will hold a **Public Hearing** regarding **RSA 189:68** on **Monday, November 16, 2015 at 6:15pm** in the **Hillsboro-Deering Elementary School Media Center.**

The purpose of the hearing is for the school board to allow the use of video and/or audio recordings in school classrooms, after written consent of the teacher and the parent or legal guardian of each affected student, for the following purposes:

- Recording classes when students are absent or unable to take notes;
- Instructional or assessment support for students with disabilities and/or students needing accommodations
- Student practice work in a photography and videography course;
- Recording a speech therapy session to evaluate a student's progress;

  - Recording an awards presentation in a class that could be posted on the school/district website.

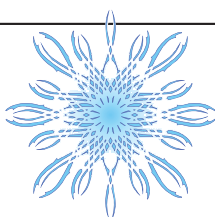

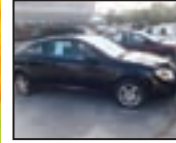

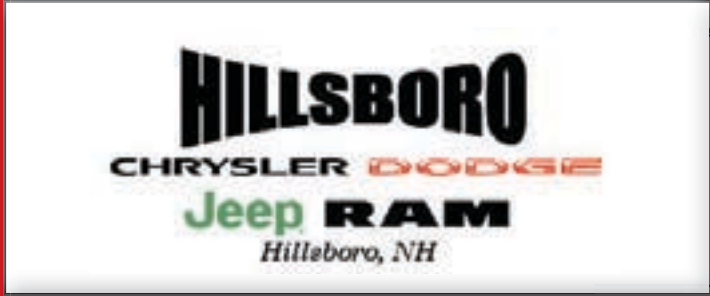
