# PUBLIC NOTICE HILLSBORO-DEERING SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Hillsboro-Deering School Board will hold a Public Hearing regarding RSA 189:68 on Monday, November 16, 2015 at 6:15pm in the Hillsboro-Deering Elementary School Media Center.

The purpose of the hearing is for the school board to allow the use of video and/ or audio recordings in school classrooms, after written consent of the teacher and the parent or legal guardian of each affected student, for the following purposes:

- Recording classes when students are absent or unable to take notes;
- Instructional or assessment support for students with disabilities and/ or students needing accommodations
  - Student practice work in a photography and videography course;
- Recording a speech therapy session to evaluate a student's progress;
  - Creating a video presentation as part of any academic class;
- Videotaping student teachers for teacher education coursework;
- Videotaping a drama class (play) or music class for instructional purposes; and/or
- Recording an awards presentation in a class that could be posted on the school/district website.

The Hillsboro-Deering School Board does not intend this list to be all-inclusive and may be subject to change from time to time.






