Goffstown School District supports Haitian relief

The Goffstown School District joined with local company Asset 360 on Friday, November 6th, to donate an ocean container-worth of furniture to Port-au-Prince, Haiti.

Hazmat Team called to Franklin's Watts Regulator

Franklin 6 hour standoff ends

Benjamin Geddis, 27, of Franklin held local police and the State Police SWAT team at bay for six hours Tuesday before finally surrendering late that afternoon. He was arrested on several outstanding warrants at about 4:50 p.m., after police had tried to arrest him since 10:45 a.m. Franklin Police tried to negotiate with Geddis and get him to come out, and the SWAT team was called after he refused to surrender. Geddis had outstanding warrants for felony second-degree assault, two felony counts of being a habitual offender, one count of felony possession of fentanyl, two misdemeanor counts of simple assault, and one misdemeanor count of theft by unauthorized taking. Franklin Police were assisted by officers from the Merrimack County Sheriff's Department, the Belknap County Sheriff's Department, and police officers from the Tilton, Northfield, and Sanbornton police departments, and the Franklin Fire Department, Ball said.

TAKE YOUR MEDICINE

About a quarter of all atrial fibrillation patients at the lowest risk for stroke receive unnecessary blood thinners from cardiology specialists, according to University of California San Francisco researchers. Their research letter appears in *JAMA Internal Medicine*.

Few doctors are prescribing a low-cost drug that has been proven effective in preventing the onset of diabetes, according to a UCLA study. The study, published in the peer-reviewed journal *Annals of Internal Medicine*, found that only 3.7 percent of U.S. adults with pre-diabetes were prescribed metformin during a recent three-year period.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has approved Kybella (deoxycholic acid), a treatment for adults with moderate-to-severe fat below the chin, known as submental fat. Using Kybella for the treatment of fat outside of the submental area is not approved and is not recommended. Kybella is administered as an injection into the fat tissue in the submental area. Patients may receive up to 50 injections in a single treatment, with up to six single treatments administered no less than one month apart. Kybella is being provided in single patient use vials and should not be diluted or mixed with any other compounds. The safety and effectiveness of Kybella for treatment of submental fat were established in two clinical trials with enrolled 1,022 adult participants with moderate to severe submental fat. Participants were randomly assigned to receive Kybella or a placebo for up to six treatments. The results showed that reductions in submental fat were observed more frequently in participants who received Kybella versus placebo.

New Boston's new Tax Rate announced

The New Boston Board of Selectmen have received confirmation from the State of NH Department of Revenue Administration that the 2015 tax rate is set as follows:

Town Rate.....	\$5.93	\$.09 increase
Local School Rate.....	\$17.09	\$ 1.10 increase
State School Rate.....	\$2.40	\$.02 increase
County Rate.....	\$1.29	\$.05 increase
Total.....	\$26.71	\$1.26 total increase

The New Boston Finance Committee/Board of Selectmen/School Administration had projected a 2015 total rate of \$27.81 per thousand. This new rate, although higher than last year, fell below that projection by \$1.10 per thousand.

Quick response saves New Boston home

A two-alarm fire in a home at a New Boston home caused heavy damage Sunday night. Fire Chief Dan MacDonald said Donald Vandenberg, owner of a Francestown Road home called 911 at 5:32 p.m. MacDonald, who lives near Francestown Road, was first on the scene, and saw fire coming from the roof and the chimney area of the home, and called for a second alarm. Firefighters got to the attic quickly and managed to keep the flames to the attic and part of the second floor, the chief said. The fire was under control in about 90 minutes. The cause of the fire is under investigation, but is not considered suspicious.

Bow's tax rate down .97/1000 to \$28.54

The New Hampshire Department of Revenue Administration has set the Town of Bow's 2015 property tax rate at \$28.54 per thousand dollars of valuation. This rate represents a \$0.97 decrease from the 2014 tax rate of \$29.51. The 2015 rate breaks down as follows: \$6.71 for the Town, \$16.48 for School District, \$2.38 for State Education, and \$2.97 for Merrimack County for a total rate of \$28.54. The property tax rate has dropped due in large part to a \$30 million dollar increase in the Town's net assessed valuation of property. The Town's net assessed valuation increased from \$1,054,318,690 to \$1,085,097,061.

Resident praises compassionate aid by Goffstown Firefighters

Goffstown resident Robert Blais recently sent a letter to Town Administrator Sue Desruisseaux commending FF Paramedic Patrick Laforge and FF/EMT Stefan Donahue.

"As Town Administrator, I thought I would send you a note about our Fire Department in Goffstown. On October 9th I was in need of an ambulance. My wife was in extreme pain in her back...I felt truly helpless so I called 911 and told them it was not an emergency, but was in need of an ambulance for my wife and explained to the person on the line what was going on. He agreed and said he would send an ambulance. Within minutes the Gofftown Fire Department showed up in the ambulance. The EMTs came in and started talking to my wife to see what they could do. Now I know that EMTs and ambulance attendants are trained, and are very experienced at what they do. But I must say that I was very impressed at the two firemen who came in. They told my wife their names... the way they handled my wife was extremely professional, but more than that it was the compassion they showed that was above and beyond. You could see that they really cared, and tried so very hard to make

her as comfortable as they could under the circumstances that they were working with. They got her to the hospital as quickly as possible, and then the hospital took over. The next morning, October 10th, we had a flag disposal ceremony at Medvil where we live and the Fire Department was invited and they came. One of the young men that was on the ambulance the day before was there. He made it a point to come to see me and inquire about my wife. You can't begin to understand how that made me feel, and with all of the work and people they must see in the course of the day, to remember a person they had seen the day before, but moreover that he would go out of his

way to inquire about her showed me how much they care for the people that they help. So I know in your position that you must receive many complaints about our people who work for our town, so I thought it would be nice to hear the positive side also. I know I was so impressed that I went to see the Chief to let him know about the performance of his firemen. They have a thankless job, and I did make a donation to the Fire Dept. I am retired and on SS, so it was a small one, but was given with a grateful heart... you might want to thank them on my behalf, and also the town that they represent. They are truly great ambassadors."

Failure to stop leads to Dunbarton crash

Dunbarton Police Officers responded to a two car crash at the intersection of routes 77 and 13, otherwise known as Page's Four Corners. An investigation revealed that a Saturn sedan being operated by an adult male from Weare was traveling south through the intersection from Jewett Road. A Ford van being operated by an adult male from Nashua was traveling east from Concord Stage Road towards Clinton Street and failed to properly stop at the eastbound stop sign, causing a crash with the Saturn in the intersection. \$15,000 grant for Franklin playground

Charron murder accomplice arrested again
