Deering Police arrest pair for selling dogs/puppies without license

Deering Police Captain Thomas Cavanaugh and Officer Stephen Bell, assisted by Animal Rescue League of NH Director of Outreach & Investigations Maureen Prendergast, conducted a joint investigation into the sale and transfer of several ill and contagious dogs and puppies during October and November 2015 in Deering.

Initial complaints were received by the Deering Police about a "Dog Adoption Day" advertised through a Facebook Page for "Pawfect Puppy" that had occurred in Deering, NH in early October. At this adoption event, several of the puppies were severely ill with the highly contagious and often deadly canine disease Parvoviral Enteritis and other diseases, worms, parasites, infections and other illnesses, which then were transmitted to other family pets after adoption. Several animals died as a result.

Following an investigation, which included undercover purchases of puppies, Cavanaugh and Bell arrested Shawna Boutwell, 44, of Chesnee, South Carolina, and Dawn Disorda, 43, of Chesnee, South Carolina. Each Defendant was charged with multiple counts of Selling Dogs/Puppies without a License, Selling Dogs/Puppies without Health Certificates, Sales of Diseased Animals, and violations of Animal Quarantine requirements. They were bailed and released pending a scheduled arraignment.

Alzheimer's disease and other dementias are common, affecting one in six people over age 80. The main drug treatments, a class of medications called cholinesterase inhibitors (i.e., donepezil, Called cholinesterase inhibitors (i.e., donepezil, galantamine, rivastigmine), are marginally benefi-cial for most patients and may have serious side effects such as gastrointestinal symptoms. These medications could result in harmful weight loss, according to a study in the Journal of the American Geriatrics Society. Weight loss is a significant problem in dementia patients and linked to increased mortality.

The controversial practice of administering pre-surgery beta-block-ers to patients having noncardiac surgery was associated with an increased risk of death in patients with no cardiac risk factors but it was beneficial for patients with three to four risk factors, according to a report published online by JAMA Surgery.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has approved Odomzo (sonidegib) to treat patients with locally advanced basal cell carci-noma that has recurred following surgery or radiation therapy, or who are not candidates for surgery or radiation surgery. Skin cancer is the most common cancer and basal cell carcinoma accounts for approximately 80 percent of non-melanoma skin cancers. Basal cell carcinoma starts in the top layer of the skin (called the aniders) carcinoma starts in the top layer of the skin (called the epidermis) and usually develops in areas that have been regularly exposed to the sun and other forms of ultraviolet radiation. According to the National Cancer Institute, the number of new cases of non-melanoma skin cancer appears to be increasing every year. Locally advanced basal cell skin cancer refers to basal cancers that have not spread to other parts of the body, but cannot be curatively treated with local treatments, specifically surgery and radiation.
