



Emergency personnel found Ryan Labbe, 27, of Merrimack, on Kearsarge Trail Snails Snowmobile Club Trail 1 in Webster near the Warner town line. Officials said Labbe was riding with a friend who lives in the area. Both told New Hampshire Fish and Game officials that they were out to "dust off the machines" in preparation for the rest of the winter.

Labbe suffered a severe leg injury and was taken to Concord Hospital. Both riders were wearing the proper gear for snow-mobiling, including helmets. Officials said rough conditions on the trail were a likely cause for Labbe to lose control and strike the trees on the edge of the trail.

Improvements to Goffstown Rail Trail

The Friends of the Goffstown Rail Trail announce the recent completion of the Transportation Enhancement (TE) project on the Goffstown Rail Trail. The most visible parts of the project are a new trailhead parking area and the safety improvements of two trail crossings of Mast Road. These crossings were realigned to make them shorter and improve visibility, and pushbutton activated crossing lights were added. The trail crossing of Henry Bridge Road also now has improved visibility and a pushbutton activated flashing crosswalk light. Finally, the nearby break in the trail due to an old road gully has been filled, eliminating an on-road detour for trail users. These areas are expected to experience increased use after winter weather ends.

The new crossing signal installed at the Mast Road locations is called a Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB). PHBs differ from common traffic lights in a few ways. They are completely dark until activated by a trail user. After a button is pressed, the PHB goes through a short sequence of flashing yellow, a few seconds of solid red lights, during which the trail user can cross, then flashing red before the signals goes dark again. This style of crossing protection in Goffstown is only the third such installation in all of New Hampshire.

Thanks to the Goffstown Public Works for their management and oversight of this important project. With this recent construction completed, one-half of the trail surface in Goffstown has been improved over the conditions left by the B&M Railroad when they pulled up the rails in the 1980's.

Franklin woman guilty of sex charge

Julie Shine, 42, of Franklin will serve 11 to 30 years in state prison, as part of a plea deal with prosecutors. Shine pleaded guilty to collaborating with her husband to sell an underage girl for sex. Her husband, William Shine was found guilty by a jury last fall of human trafficking and endangering the welfare of a child, and is currently serving a 14 to 60-year sentence. The couple arranged to sell the 14-year-old girl to a police informant in November of 2014.
