Seacoast Science Center launches Ocean Runner video blog series

RYE, NH — Bringing together her love of ocean education and beach running, the Seacoast Science Center's Development Director Nichole Rutherford, of York, Maine, is hosting a year-long video blog series that offers expert answers to common questions about coastal ecosystems. Dubbed the Ocean Runner, Nichole will appear in weekly video blogs tackling subjects from tides and pollution to marine animals and undersea research in short content bites. The videos are produced to be of interest to all ages and often enlist the help of the naturalist staff at the Seacoast Science Center and other local experts.

"As an avid runner, my favorite places to train are the beaches of New Hampshire and Southern Maine, and I'm always coming up with questions to ask my colleagues about the things I've seen," explained Nichole. "I think a lot of people have the same questions about the ocean, tidal marshes and the beach, so this new blog is a way to share what I learn with a bigger audience. I am lucky to be working with knowledgeable biologists at the Seacoast Science Center who can answer most any question I pose."

Among the first topics to be featured on the Ocean Runner blog are a closer look at the lives of hermit crabs commonly found on the New England coast, and what to do if you find an abandoned lobster trap on the beach (there are state and

federal regulations). Future topics planned include deep ocean research, salt marsh ecology, seaweed overgrowth, marine mammal strandings and tide fluctuations. The Center's goal is to address each issue in a concise yet engaging way, furthering the organization's goal of providing ocean education for all. The Seacoast Science Center, located in Odiorne Point State Park, Rte. 1A in Rye, New Hampshire, is open from 10 am–5 pm each day through October, and Saturdays-Mondays from October through mid-February.

Loon Preservation Committee Hosts Live Loon Cam

For the third year in a row, the Loon Preservation Committee has a live webcam focused on a pair of nesting loons on a lake in the Lakes Region of New Hampshire. The first egg was laid on May 15 so LPC biologists expect to see a chick around June 11 if all goes well. This pair is among the first loons in the state to initiate a nest; the peak of loon nest initiation usually occurs around the first week of June in New Hampshire. Since both adults are banded with unique combinations of color bands LPC biologists have confirmed that it is the same pair of loons as last year.

In 2014, the male of the pair was rescued by LPC staff after webcam viewers reported the loon appeared to be tangled in monofilament line, a potentially lethal condition. Just days after the loon was rescued the pair hatched two chicks and both survived to migrate to the ocean in the fall. Last year, this pair hatched one chick that also successfully left the lake in the fall.

The loon webcam gives LPC biologists an invaluable look at the habits and challenges faced by nesting loons in New Hampshire, including black

flies, predators, flooded nests, and intruding loons. It also allows LPC to share this intimate look into the life of loons with its members and the public. To see the LIVE loon cam please visit www.loon.org/ looncam.php.

Loon Preservation Committee biologists recorded 289 pairs of loons on New Hampshire lakes in 2015, more than three times the number of loons present in the mid 1970s when LPC began its work to protect and grow the population. However, loons are facing growing challenges and the impacts of climate change and other threats are increasingly being felt by New Hampshire's small loop oppulation.

Loons are a threatened species in New Hampshire and are protected by state and federal laws from hunting or harassment. If you see a sick or injured loon, please call the Loon Preservation Committee (603-476-5666) or if you observe harassment of loons, please contact the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department (603-271-3361) or Marine Patrol (603-293-2037) for assistance.

The Loon Preservation Committee monitors loons

throughout the state as part of its mission to restore and maintain a healthy population of loons in New Hampshire; to monitor the health and productivity of loon populations as sentinels of environmental quality; and to promote a greater understanding of loons and the natural world.



There's nothing like the start of a new season: **Opening Days for the White Mountains Attractions**

NORTH WOODSTOCK, NH - From the top of Mount Washington to the underground worlds of Polar Caves Park and Lost River Gorge, many of New Hampshire's White Mountains Attractions are set to open their doors for the summer. This popular New England region has been a vacation destination for generations of visitors, where trips to Story Land, Clark's Trading Post and Santa's Village are family traditions.

Others look for adventures by heading up Mount Washington via the Cog Railway or the Auto Road, while Attitash, Wildcat, Cranmore, Loon and Cannon Mountains offer panoramic views from their summits via aerial lifts, ziplines and ropes courses. The Conway Scenic Railroad and the Hobo Railroad take excursions through beautiful mountain scenery.

"The good weather has finally arrived and we look forward to it carrying through the summer," said Jayne O'Connor, president of White Mountains

Attractions Association in North Woodstock. "It will be tough to beat last year's record numbers at some of the attractions," she said, "since we had near-perfect weather all summer. But with the early interest we have had so far this spring, it feels like we'll have another outstanding season." Visitors can look forward to a couple of exciting new adventures this summer, with the Polar Ascent and Rappel at Polar Caves Park in Rumney and many property improvements at the other attractions including new platforms and/or boardwalks at Alpine Adventures, the Flume Gorge and Lost River Gorge, a new Wolfman





at Clark's Trading Post, and expanded hiking trails at the summit of Cranmore Mountain. O'Connor noted that for visitors looking to plan an earlier getaway, several of our popular attractions are running now and they'll find the remaining attractions will open Memorial Day Weekend and forthcoming weekends until the summer season gets into full swing Father's Day weekend.

Alpine Adventures, the Conway Scenic Railroad, the Flume Gorge, Lost River Gorge & Boulder Caves, and Polar Caves Park are currently operating daily. The Mt. Washington Auto Road and Mt. Washington Cog Railway are open for drive yourself and train tours to tree-line and the summit (weather permitting) of Mt. Washington weekends until Memorial Day weekend when excursions begin daily. The scenic Cannon Mountain Aerial Tram will whisk visitors 4000 feet above Franconia Notch beginning May 20.

The Hobo Railroad in Lincoln is open weekends beginning May 28 to June 12 and opens daily on June 24. Santa's Village in Jefferson, along with Story Land in Glen and Clark's Trading Post in Lincoln are open weekends beginning May 28 and begin daily operations in mid-June.

Also open weekends only until mid-June are Loon Mountain in Lincoln and Cranmore Mountain in North Conway.




Attitash Mountain (daily starting June 18); Wildcat Mountain (daily July 2) and Whale's Tale Water Park (daily beginning June 8).

Wine and hors d'oeuvres will be served at the Friday evening reception. A \$15 donation per person is suggested. The WCA owns and operates the Red






Documentary on Blacklisted Actress at Nashua Library


