

# Winona LaDuke at KSC Nov. 29th as Mariposa opens exhibit

## Winona LaDuke at KSC Nov. 29th as Mariposa Opens Exhibit, Art of Resistance on Nov. 30th

For decades, Honor the Earth Founder Winona LaDuke has been a formidable force in the renewable energy movement. From the Anishinaabe culture of Minnesota, she is especially prominent in indigenous-led efforts to stop construction of pipelines that threatens water and traditional Native American food sources and cultures. She is the recipient of numerous human rights awards and is a two-time vice presidential candidate for the Green Party with Ralph Nader.

Of late, LaDuke and Honor the Earth have worked closely with the Standing Rock Sioux and two grassroots groups, the Sacred Stones Camp and Red Warrior Camp, as well as the Sierra Club and the Indigenous Environmental Network, in a legal battle by numerous tribes to prevent Enbridge and the Dakota Access Pipeline from constructing a fracked oil pipeline beneath the Missouri River, a watershed impacting millions. The pipeline will bring fracked oil from the Bakken Fields in North Dakota, 1,172 miles to Patoka, Illinois. Tribes allege its construction beneath the river will jeopardize their only water supply, threaten sacred grounds in violation of treaties. They contend construction is moving forward without due diligence required by law to assess environmental and cultural impact.



On Nov. 29th at 7 p.m., the Mariposa Museum will present LaDuke in person in a talk entitled, The News from Standing Rock, at Keene State College's Alumni Recital Hall in the Redfern Arts Building. The talk occurs on

the eve of the opening of Honor the Earth's exhibit, Art of Resistance, at the Mariposa in Peterborough. Both events are being co-presented by Mariposa with NH State Council on the Arts, C&S Wholesale Grocers, and KSC's Diversity and Multiculturalism Office and Departments of American Studies and Women's and Gender Studies. Supporting Sponsors include Devine Flooring (Wilton), Joseph's Coat (Peterborough), Annie Faulkner and Bob King. Additional sponsors are David Baum, John and Connie Kielely, and Nubanusit Neighborhood and Farm.

At KSC, LaDuke will talk about Honor the Earth and the exhibit and also what the gathering of indigenous people on the Standing Rock Sioux Reservation in North Dakota -- history's largest international gathering of indigenous people -- means to the Dakota Access Pipeline protest, the

renewable energy movement, indigenous people, water, and us all. Exhibit curators Kim Smith and Charlie Thayer will also speak about how a new generation of indigenous young people are getting engaged in the environmental and human rights movement. Both Smith and Thayer have spent months at the Standing Rock gathering and were among the first groups arrested. Smith and Thayer will be in NH for a week following the event and are available to speak with school groups and other parties.

Tickets for the talk are \$10 and can be purchased by phone or in person through KSC's Redfern Box Office: (603) 358-2168. Students must show an ID with purchase. The exhibit, Art of Resistance, from Honor the Earth, opens the following evening at 6:30 on Nov. 30th, at the Mariposa Museum in Peterborough with a reception that is free and open to the public. Curators Kim Smith and Charlie Thayer will speak about their vision for the exhibit, a 30-year retrospective of Native American art work linked to environmental and human rights campaigns. The exhibit has been traveling around the country. It will run at the Mariposa through Feb. 26th, and can be seen Dec. 1st onwards during regular museum hours, Tuesdays through Sundays, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission after the opening is \$6 adults, \$5 seniors, and \$4 for children. The Museum is located at 26 Main Street, Peterborough.


# Candlelight Stroll - a "Vintage Christmas in Portsmouth"

On these weekend evenings, the Museum grounds glow with hundreds of lighted candle lanterns, the houses are adorned with thousands of hand-made decorations crafted from live greens and dried flowers and herbs collected from the Museum gardens, and the air is filled with the sound of holiday music and scent of woodsmoke from the bonfire. Its authenticity is the foundation for the claim that the Vintage Christmas in Portsmouth holiday celebration, echoed by Travel + Leisure magazine, makes Portsmouth 'the Christmas capital of North America.'

Visitors stroll from house to historic house, greeted by costumed role players and performers who recreate



the traditions of times past, rediscovering the joys of simpler times. Mrs. Shapiro prepares a Hanukkah celebration her 1919 Russian Jewish kitchen. Mrs. Goodwin, her family and servants prepare a Victorian Christmas. Father Christmas, the night watchman, "Mayor Frank Jones" and other role-players make their rounds along the dirt lanes; and the Abbotts await news of their soldier fighting in Europe in the Second



World War. Carolers, chestnuts and holiday crafts bring all the sounds, scents and moments for family 'stopfulness' to this event that is a cherished New Hampshire tradition. Complimentary refreshments and hot apple cider are offered at the Cider Shed. Traditional hearth-cooking demonstrations, crafts demonstrations, and winter projects for kids provide interactive fun for multiple generations.

# What's new at Mt Washington Valley's ski resorts and XC Centers

With an above-normal snow prediction for this winter, Mt Washington Valley's ski resorts and XC Centers are poised for a booming ski season and plenty of happy skiers on the trails.

In an informal survey of Mt Washington Valley's ski resorts and XC Centers, it became clear that millions of dollars have been invested in new technology to allow snowmaking and snow management to become more efficient, powerful and eco-friendly. Skiers will be treated to expanded trails, guest infrastructure and guest services improvements at Mt Washington Valley's 13 ski resorts and XC Centers.

Here's a rundown of what's new at Mt Washington Valley's ski resorts and XC Centers for the 2016-17 ski season.

**At Black Mountain**, 52 new next-gen low-energy snow guns have been added along with the installation of a state-of-the-art snowmaking control system to increase efficiency in creating snow to carpet the trails. Additionally, a new snow groomer and tractor have been added to the grooming fleet. Skiers will also delight in the new mid-mountain cabin offering up hot food and beverages on weekends and holidays.

**At Bretton Woods Ski Resort and Bretton Woods XC Center** nearly \$500,000 has been invested over the summer to increase snowmaking operation efficiency. This will allow expanded terrain throughout



the season. In addition, investment in the alpine and Nordic grooming fleets will result in even better snow management than previous years. A new Pisten Bully PB400 Alpine Groomer joined the Bretton Woods Snow Quality fleet. And this year Fat Bikes will be available for rental along with dedicated trails for winter biking.

In September, **Cranmore Mountain Resort** broke ground on Phase One of Kearsarge Brook Condominiums at Cranmore. This is the first phase of a \$50 million development that will transform the resort into a vibrant mixed-use community with year-round residences and expanded base facilities. When the project is completed, six new buildings and a total of 106 condominiums will have been added to Cranmore's base. The first two buildings will be residential, while the third and fourth will replace existing base lodges with 45,000 square feet of new lodge space. Phase



One of Kearsarge Brook Condominiums now under construction is located at the base of the ski area's South Slope, and will offer up 18 two- and three-bedroom residences when completed next year.

Additionally, having been recognized in the past for its sustainability practices, Cranmore will be one of the first ski resorts East of the Mississippi to add an electric/diesel driven snow cat to its grooming fleet. **Great Glen Trails** has invested in improvements to increase terrain during early and low snow seasons. An expanded snowmaking system will maximize efficiency. Plus, two trails were reconstructed to allow them to be opened earlier in the season. The addition of a second snowmobile for early season and low snow grooming will add to the center's ability to offer cross country terrain as early as possible this year.

capital campaign. Six kilometers (4 miles, 3 trails) of new trails were added over the summer in the largest trail expansion/improvement project in the Jackson XC Center's history.

**King Pine Ski Area** has taken advantage of the off-season maintaining a fully functioning lift infrastructure comprised of three triple chairs, two surface lifts and a snowtubing tow and has also renovated the "Milt's Place" base lodge situated near by to the base of the Black Bear triple. King Pine has also been servicing its efficient, modern snowmaking system during the off-season so that the ski area can be 100-percent open early and throughout the season to accommodate its many ski school and race programs, night skiing and guests staying slopeside at Purity Spring Resort.

**Attitash Mountain Resort** has installed more than 1000 feet of new high-pressure, low-e gun friendly snowmaking pipe on Pinball Alley while also

widening and re-grading the trail. This snowmaking and trail improvement makes for an easier connection for guests of all abilities to travel from trails at Attitash's Bear Peak to its' main mountain. Additionally, Attitash's Abenaki Park Crew will introduce a beginner elements area creating three tiers of progression through the Abenaki Parks: beginner at Bear Peak Base, progressions at Kachina Park, and large features on Myth Maker. This means freestyle terrain will be available for all levels. This winter, guests at The Attitash Grand Summit Hotel will notice a number of upgrades to the property and accommodations. Exterior improvements have been made to the building's entryway, walkways, and driveway. Additionally, new carpets and furniture have been added to in the rooms, and the pool entrance received an update too.

Guests at **Wildcat Mountain** will notice a few new additions to their visits during this 2016/17

winter season. Wildcat Mountain has spent the past two summers working to enhance its glades, clearing over 180 combined acres to enhance tree skiing and riding across the mountain. All glades noted on the Wildcat trail map have now been maintained to USFS guidelines.

Long time General Manager Edward Rock, is retiring after 34 years at the helm of **Shawnee Peak**. Rock plans to step down at the end of September but will remain at the mountain as a senior advisor through 2017. Ralph Lewis, a Maine native, has accepted the position of General Manager. Lewis has extensive experience in the ski industry most recently as Director of Skiing Operations at Loon Mountain, where he worked for 19 years. He is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and Bridgton Academy. Lewis will officially start in late September.


