


Tips for machine quilting

Use a Walking Foot. Invest in a Walking Foot (sometimes called an Even Feed Foot) if you don't have one. A walking foot will make your fabric feed evenly on the top and the bottom, not just on the bottom like a regular presser foot will. **Use a Quilting Needle.** This makes a difference. Don't use a Universal Needle, which has a slightly rounded point, for machine quilting. **Decrease Your Presser Foot Pressure.** It makes it easier for the quilt sandwich to move through the machine. This can also help with any tucking or puckering on the back of your quilt. **Use Quilting Gloves.** These gloves are grippy and will be a revelation to you if you've been quilting without them. They enable you to really firmly hold on to the quilt as you move it through the machine. **Change Your Needles Often.** It's never good to let your needle get dull. This can cause problems – like skipped stitches – and needles are cheap. Some people change their needles every time they begin a new quilt.

Loons nesting on Loon Preservation Committee's Live Loon Cam

The Loon Preservation Committee (LPC) is streaming live video of a pair of nesting loons on a lake in the Lakes Region of New Hampshire at www.loon.org. This is the fourth year LPC has shared the live feed with the public, and the high definition video captured the first of two eggs being laid on May 21. LPC biologists expect to see chicks around June 17-18 if all goes well. This pair is among the first loons in the state to initiate a nest; the peak of loon nest initiation usually occurs around the first week of June in New Hampshire. LPC biologists banded both adults with unique combinations of color bands and LPC has confirmed that it is the same pair of loons as last year. In 2014, the male of the pair was rescued by LPC staff after webcam viewers reported the loon appeared to be tangled in monofilament line, a potentially lethal condition. Just days after the loon was rescued the pair hatched two chicks and both survived to migrate to the ocean in the fall. Last year, this pair sat on an inviable egg for 59 days (31 days past the expected hatch date). After an unsuccessful year in 2016, the Loon Preservation Committee is hoping for a successful hatch in 2017.



and grow the population. However, loons are facing growing challenges and the impacts of climate change and other threats are increasingly being felt by New Hampshire's small loon population.

Loons are a threatened species in New Hampshire and are protected by state and federal laws from hunting or harassment. 
The loon webcam gives LPC biologists an

invaluable look at the habits and challenges faced by nesting loons in New Hampshire, including black flies, predators, flooded nests, and intruding loons. Loon Preservation Committee biologists recorded 294 pairs of loons on New Hampshire lakes in 2016, more than three times the number of loons present in the mid 1970s when LPC began its work to protect





Wild As We Came Here, 2017

Hailing from the Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia, The Steel Wheels are familiar with the traditions of folk music and how a string band is supposed to sound. In fact, they've been drawing on those steadfast traditions for more than a decade. Yet their name also evokes a sense of forward motion, which is clearly reflected in



their latest album, Wild As We Came Here.

"I think we've always been able to write new songs with different landscapes. However it was really enjoyable for us, creatively and artistically, to depart from the straight-up acoustic sound that we've been known for," says Trent Wagler, who plays guitar and banjo in the band and writes most of the material. "I'm excited to see what happens. There are fans out there who are ready for this and who have been waiting for us to do this."

While on tour supporting Josh Ritter, the band forged a friendship with Sam Kassirer, who plays keyboards for Ritter on tour and has produced a number of his albums. While The Steel Wheels had been considering other producers and maybe recording in Nashville, they chose to follow their instincts all the way to rural Maine, where Kassirer owns a recording studio inside a renovated farmhouse from the 18th century. All four band members – Wagler, Eric Brubaker (fiddle), Brian Dickel (upright bass), and Jay Lapp (mandolin) – hunkered down for a week and a half to create Wild As We Came Here.




