# John Paul Jones birthday celebration set for July 8

Sunday, July 8, 2018 1-4pm,  
John Paul Jones House Museum  
& Garden, National Historic  
Landmark. 43 Middle Street,  
Portsmouth, New Hampshire. Free  
admission, house tours, music  
with Great Bay Sailor, family fun,  
refreshments. Father of US Navy:  
"I have not yet begun to fight!"

Portsmouth, New  
Hampshire...Always wondered  
how you could hang out on the  
lawn of that gorgeous yellow  
mansion on the corner of Middle  
and State Streets in downtown  
Portsmouth? Always wanted to  
peek inside the house but haven't  
put that on your calendar yet?

Now's your chance. On Sunday  
July 8 at 1pm, the Portsmouth Historical Society,  
which runs Discover Portsmouth and which saved  
the John Paul Jones House in 1917, is hosting its free  
annual birthday party for the father of the US Navy,  
who spoke the immortal words, "I have not yet begun  
to fight!" (John Paul Jones was born 271 years ago,  
on July 6, 1747)



Come to 43 Middle Street at 1pm for patriotic  
festivities, live music provided by perennial favorite  
Great Bay Sailor, cake and family fun, including a  
book signing. Michael and Michelle Mitchell will  
be on hand to sign copies of their new comic book  
about John Paul Jones. Admission and house tours are  
free to the public. In addition to the several galleries  
devoted to John Paul Jones, the Russo-Japanese Peace

Treaty signed in Portsmouth in  
1905, Portsmouth's maritime  
history, and local paintings and  
decorative arts, we are again  
featuring a special exhibition.  
This year's exhibit is titled,  
"Overlooked and Undervalued:  
Three Hundred Years of Women's  
Art from the Seacoast" and  
features works of art of many  
types by women from the  
Seacoast area.

### About John Paul Jones

Scottish born naval captain  
and colonial America's first sea  
warrior, John Paul Jones visited  
New Hampshire twice. In 1777 he  
took the Portsmouth-built Ranger  
with a Piscataqua crew to France.

There he worried the British in a series of guerilla  
raids before his famous battle on the Bon Homme  
Richard. Later, a hero decorated by the king of France,  
he returned to Portsmouth to fit out the America, the  
largest ship of war ever built in the nation to that day.  
While he was here, Jones stayed at the Purcell House,  
today the John Paul Jones House.

## 'Wooden Ships' tribute set for July 7

On Saturday, July 7, 2018 at 7 pm, Wooden Ships, comprised of Norman Coulombe, Don Coulombe, John Cucci and Tim Dion will be performing a concert featuring the music of Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young at the Medallion Opera House, Gorham Town Hall, 20 Park Street in Gorham. Sponsored by The Tassey Group and Color Works, tickets for this performance (\$12.00/ adults, \$8.00/under 18) are available on line at [www.medallionoperahouse.org](http://www.medallionoperahouse.org), at the Gorham Town Hall and the White Mountain Café or at the door on the evening of the concert. Crosby, Stills & Nash (CSN) were a folk rock super group made up of American singer-songwriters David Crosby and Stephen Stills and English American, singer-songwriter Graham Nash. They became known as Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young (CSNY) when joined by Canadian singer-songwriter Neil Young, who was an occasional fourth member. They were noted for their intricate vocal harmonies, often tumultuous interpersonal relationships, political activism, and lasting influence on US music and culture. Crosby, Stills & Nash were inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and all three members were also inducted for their work in other groups (Crosby for the Byrds, Stills

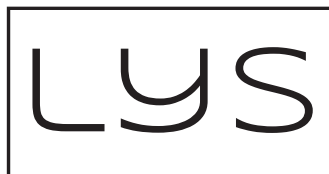


for Buffalo Springfield and Nash for the Hollies). Neil Young has also been inducted as a solo artist and as a member of Buffalo Springfield.

Tim Dion, a well-known musician from Northern New Hampshire, works as a solo performer all across New England. He has worked as a vocalist and guitarist with several bands over the past 30 years and is presently working with the bands, Wooden Ships and Long Road Home. Tim studied music, voice, and theatre at Keene State College. He taught voice at E. U. Wurlitzer in Portsmouth, NH and maintained a roster of private vocal students in Dover, NH. Tim has worked as an entertainer for "Norwegian Cruise Lines" since 2007 and on the *Pride of America*, the *Norwegian Dawn*, the *Norwegian Spirit*, the *Norwegian Jade*, and was a member of the inaugural crew of the *Norwegian Epic*. Tim has performed for audiences of all ages all over the world. He has performed with artists Benji King, (from The Turtles and Patti Smyth and Scandal), Steve Williams (#1 Country Hit-"Red Neck Yacht Club") and Toby Beau ("My Angel Baby") just to name a few.

Don Coulombe has honed his craft as a singer, songwriter and comedian for over 40 years. He is known in the industry as "The Man Who Can Do It All". The Don Who? Variety Show and his various holiday shows continue to entertain audiences throughout the United States and Canada. Don has performed in the Vegas Production, "V, the Ultimate Variety Show" alongside many other well-known entertainers. He has also performed in Atlantic City as part of the SuperStar Theater, in New York City at the Turning Stone Casino, in Pennsylvania at Langtry's Showplace and many familiar places in New Hampshire; Mount Washington Cruise Ships, The Balsams Grand Hotel and the Mount Washington Grand Hotel to name a few. Norm Coulombe is an experienced musician who plays several instruments. Along with brother Don, Norm formed Fox & Company, one of the top drawing bands in New England, Canada, Bermuda and Puerto Rico. Together they performed many popular tunes from the past five decades and composed a number of original songs producing three bestselling albums. In addition to Fox & Company, Norm has performed with The Switch, Soft Touch, My Brother's Band and in his solo show, *One for the Money*. Once again, the brothers unite their spectacular harmonies for Wooden Ships as they pay tribute to four musical greats: Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young.

# American Independence Festival brings history to life

Exeter, NH - There may be no better place in the entire nation to celebrate American history than Exeter, New Hampshire, a quaint, historic, nearly 400 year-old town that served as state capital during the Revolutionary War.

Every July, the town celebrates this history with the American Independence Festival, which features militia encampments, battle re-enactments, costumed re-enactors, nationally-recognized traditional artisans, colonial inspired beer, music, children's activities, local craft and food vendors, and more.

This year's event takes place on Saturday, July 14 on the landscaped property of the American Independence Museum, Festival organizer and host. Spilling out onto the streets of Exeter, the Festival also takes place on adjoining Swasey Parkway (alongside Exeter River), which serves as backdrop for an American and British troop encampment and battle portrayal that delights visitors.

In addition to the day's activities, which also features multiple cannon firings, the event highlights the museum's incredible collection. Items in its collection include handwritten drafts of the US Constitution and a Dunlap Broadside, the first official printing of the Declaration of Independence that was read to Exeter townspeople on July 16, 1776 (and read again to Festival-goers each year). The Festival is the



one day every year in which original copies of these documents are on view to the public.

In total, more than 4,000 people are expected to visit downtown Exeter, which includes numerous shops and restaurants that remain open during the Festival. Just one hour north of Boston and southwest

of Portland Maine, Exeter is accessible from both locations by train. Located within walking distance to numerous parks and extensive trails and just 15 miles from the ocean, the town and museum has quietly begun to shake off the moniker as "NH's best kept secret." ▶

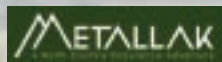

About the American Independence Museum Founded in 1991 in historic downtown Exeter,

the private, not-for-profit American Independence Museum includes the Ladd-Gilman House (c.1721) and Folsom Tavern (c.1775). Its collection includes one of only 26 surviving copies of the Dunlap Broadside, an original printing of the Declaration of Independence, two rare drafts of the U.S. Constitution, and what is believed to be an original Purple Heart awarded by General George Washington (who also visited Folsom Tavern). In addition to presenting



the American Independence Festival, the museum hosts guided tours and year round family-friendly events and interactive programs to showcase New Hampshire's rich colonial history.

## Youth, elder event at Ecovillage

ECOVILLAGE PATHWAYS - LA CITÉ ECOVILLAGE, New Hampshire. How can we catalyze healthy culture across the generations? How do ecovillages serve as fertile ground for youth and elder collaboration in wider culture? A group of people passionate about intergenerational community connection gathered this past weekend at an event called Ecovillage Pathways, an annual event in it's 5th year. This year's gathering was hosted at La Cité Écologique de New Hampshire, an ecovillage with 35+ years and three generations of experience. Participants learned from the community's alternative school, ecological businesses and hillside organic farm.



This highly unique three-day event brought together those who have been living for decades with those inheriting new leadership in reflection, inspiration, and celebration. Present at the event were 30+ participants, ages ranging from 3 to 88 years old. Together they explored the emergent future of thriving community. The first day of the event was focused on exploring intergenerational relations, with a facilitated dialogue and a video call with community movement elders from around the world. Elders from La Cité expressed tears of gratitude for feeling deeply seen as respected leaders of the community and sharing their burden of responsibility with the youth. The second day was organized using Open Space Technology to give participants an opportunity to share about their knowledge and passions. "Movement building requires accumulative knowledge so that each younger generation doesn't start at the square one again," said participant Crystal who is creating Feminist Oasis, a community advancing equitable practices and building sustainable alternatives to systemic oppression. "The generational respect and honor for elders experience while remaining open for new universal shifts guided by the youth was very refreshing and inspiring to witness and be part of."

Ecovillage Pathways organizers were able to offer significant scholarships to participants who otherwise wouldn't have been able to attend the event, including a family with a three-year-old daughter hoping to start a community school in India. # Castle in the Clouds shares its preservation story

Moultonborough – Since 2006, the Castle Preservation Society has been engaged in restoration of the Lucknow estate, the 10,000 square foot mansion deemed “Castle in the Clouds” upon its opening in 1959. On Friday, June 15th, the historic New Hampshire landmark welcomes the public to celebrate the opening of a new exhibit that tells this story; a story of mystery and discovery, preservation and restoration, research and interpretation. Lucknow Revealed: Research, Restoration and Mystery at Castle in the Clouds invites guests to learn how the



Castle’s restoration team is uncovering the past to reveal the secrets of its design and construction and how it is being preserved for generations to come. This interactive exhibit also welcomes visitors to see how they can help solve ongoing research mysteries.

“We love providing this behind-the-scenes experience for our visitors, because it brings them closer to our mission and why we exist as a non-profit organization,” explains Charles Clark, Executive Director at Castle in the Clouds. “Each visit, donation, membership – all the support we receive from our patrons – plays a part in making what guests will see in the new exhibit happen, and we are proud to be able to share those intimate details.” The Exhibit Opening Reception will take place in The Carriage House Gallery at 5:30pm; tickets are free for members and \$10 for non-members, and may be purchased at the door. Guests can enjoy wine and light refreshments while viewing objects documenting architectural and interior design at the Castle, historic photographs of the Castle’s construction, and restoration project highlights. A gallery talk will be provided by Director of Collections & Interpretation, Michelle Landry.

In addition to the Exhibit Opening Reception, Castle in the Clouds is nearing another milestone in sharing the Lucknow estate with the public. For the first time in over a decade, the basement of the Castle will be open daily for tours beginning July 1st. The one-hour guided tour will be offered three times a day, and will cover the highlights of the Castle’s unique state-of-the-art construction in 1914, the ultra-modern appliances and amenities enjoyed by owners Tom and

Olive Plant, and a glimpse into the lives of the servants who helped run and manage the Lucknow Estate in the 1910s and 1920s.

Guests will see first-hand the mechanisms that powered the modern day systems of the estate, such as ammonia-brine refrigeration and central vacuum systems, as well as technologies and features that exist only in the basement. Tickets for basement tours must be purchased online in advance and are sold as a bundle with tickets to tour the main house. As a member benefit, Castle in

the Clouds members may tour both the house and the basement for a discounted price of \$10.

Castle in the Clouds is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, whose mission is to preserve, restore, and share the historic Lucknow Estate. Each visit supports the mission and helps to ensure the enjoyment and enrichment of generations to come. 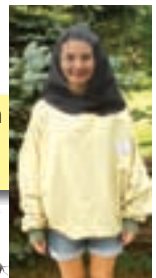

# Growing herbs in containers

Herbs are easily grown in containers and can make a great addition to any sunny small garden, balcony, patio, or front stoop. Container grown herbs are perfect for anyone with limited space or time to garden. The uses of herbs are many, and almost any herb can be grown in a container as long as the right growing conditions are provided. If your container garden site receives at least six or more hours of direct sun a day, your herbs should perform well.

Start by choosing the right containers for your herbs. An appropriate container will provide enough room to support the plant's roots throughout the entire growing season, will be stable enough to support the plant and not tip over in the wind, and provide adequate drainage. Containers should be wide and deep enough for the herbs planted. Containers that are too small tend to dry out quickly and cause plants to wilt. On the other hand, pots that are too large often stay wet for too long and may lead to root rot. It's essential that all containers have



a drainage hole(s) in the bottom to allow excess water to drain freely.

A quality soilless potting mix is the best choice for growing herbs and can be found at any garden center. Soilless mixes are called such because they do not contain any garden soil. Instead, they are primarily composed of peat, perlite, and vermiculite, bark, or coconut hulls – materials that hold moisture while also providing good aeration.

When it comes time to select the herbs you grow,

pay attention to whether they are annuals or perennials. Annual herbs such as cilantro and basil will only produce for one season, whereas perennial herbs such as rosemary, thyme, and lemon verbena can live for years if they are brought indoors for the winter. Also, don't forget to pay attention to the growing requirements of your individual plants. Most herbs prefer moist, well-drained soils and can be planted together in the same container. Other herbs, such as rosemary, prefer things on the drier side and perform better when

planted singly.

Most herbs are quite easy to grow and will reward you throughout the season and possibly beyond. Try growing your own fresh herbs in containers this summer!

### Twenty Seven More Players Qualify From Bretwood Golf Course

Keene, NH- As the 115th New Hampshire State Amateur is just a mere two week away, 27 more players have qualified to play at Hanover today at the Bretwood Golf Course Qualifier. Even with a quick rain delay during the middle of the round, anyone who kept their scores at 81 or below made the list.

Austin Fox, of Intervale Country Club, was able to card the low round of the day at 2 under par, 70. He opened his round with a strong birdie, to get his momentum going. Fox carded a total of four birdies throughout his 18 holes and only had two bogeies which helped secure his name at the top of the qualifying board.

Among the other players who qualified today is Colin McCaigue of Bretwood Golf Course, who used his home course knowledge to card a one under par, 71 today and shot four total birdies. Marshall Haplin of Hoodcroft Country Club was also able to card a one under par, 71 round today. His birdie on the first hole as well as his birdie on hole 12 worked to help keep his score low today.

Here is only one qualifier left on the schedule

which will be played at Concord Country Club. The last group of players will attempt to join the list of those who have already qualified along with the exempt players on July 8th for the start of the New Hampshire State Amateur Championship.

# Golden Oak folk music at the Medallion Opera House

GoldenOak, an emerging sound in New England folk music, will be performing on Friday, July 6th at 7:30 pm at the Medallion Opera House, 20 Park Street, Gorham Town Hall. The Medallion is offering a special "2 Shows for \$20" deal when tickets are purchased together for both the GoldenOak concert on Friday, July 6th and the Wooden Ships concert on Saturday, July 7th (Tribute to Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young). A Portland, Maine based, Indie-Soul-Folk, sibling duo, Zak and Lena Kendall were born and raised in the Sandy River Valley of Western Maine. The two started making music together as kids and the bond of brother and sister is evident in their carefully crafted songs, poetic lyrics, and flowing harmonies. Influenced early by legends like Crosby, Stills, Nash, and Young, Simon and Garfunkel, and The Band, and by the like of Fleet Foxes, First Aid Kit, and Ray LaMontagne.

GoldenOak began writing music and performing in 2014. Their early songs led to their first official release, Pleasant St., in 2016, an album they co-wrote with cellist Seth Wegner. The full length album painted the landscape of the duo's childhood and



their experiences growing up and leaving home. Appropriately, they recorded with accompaniments on electric guitar, cello, and trumpet, from hometown friends. The original album with beautiful instrumentation and voice solidified the band as ambassadors of the Maine Folk Scene.

Following Pleasant St. Zak and Lena produced the Acadia Sessions, a series of live video sessions to highlight the album as they toured widely in the Northeast gaining in audience and recognition. The homegrown and honest approach of the band shows integrity and style, earning them praise across the board. The success of Pleasant St. and the following

tour gained GoldenOak a nomination as "one of Portland's most important upcoming bands" by Dispatch Magazine.

In October 2017, GoldenOak released Foxgloves, a 6 track EP that builds on Zak and Lena's folk roots with a remarkable orchestral approach. On the EP, the siblings expand their earthy sound and songwriting with percussion, piano, trumpet, cello, and violin. Evlvement Radio said of the EP, "the vocals are little more than another pair of instruments adding another exquisite layer of atmosphere to the songs. It's not until 'side two' of the EP that Zak and Lena's vocals take center stage in the mix. When they do step out vocally, they bring a stunning release of energy to the songs." The band kicked off their Foxgloves release tour with a sold out show at Portland's One Longfellow Square, and in December, Foxgloves was voted "EP of the Year" by the Portland Music Awards. As GoldenOak evolves and pushes boundaries, they continue to sow seeds in a rich folk tradition.

Zak and Lena record and often tour with fellow musicians and band mates, Mike Knowles (Bass), Max Eddington (piano), and Jackson Cromwell (percussion). Over the last two years, they shared the stage with many notable artists such as Lady Lamb, The Dustbowl Revival, The Ghost of Paul Revere, The Mallett Brothers Band, and Parsonsfield.
