Newport to receive over \$3 million in settlement

The town of Newport has settled a longstanding lawsuit against the engineering firm that was hired to oversee the construction of a new wastewater treatment plant, netting a little more than \$3 million in the process. In 2009, the town was ordered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to make upgrades to the wastewater treatment plant due to phosphorous in the water, according to reports. The town hired Los Angeles-based company AECOM to design and oversee the construction of the upgrades.

The lawsuit alleged that the filtration system to reduce the phosphorus did not work well enough to meet EPA standards. This forced the town to shut down the filtration system and design and build a new system.

Newport filed suit against AECOM and WesTech, a Utah based company, and Penta Corp out of Moultonborough,

which resulted in countersuits filed against the town.

The recent decision to settle the case means that AECOM will pay \$2.7 mil-

lion to the town, WesTech will pay \$650,000, and Penta Corp will pay \$75,000. That money will get paid over time.


