

Tickets now on sale for 6th Annual Halcyon Music Festival June 20-29

24 world-class musicians to perform seven chamber music concerts in Portsmouth over just 10 days. The 2019 Halcyon Music Festival returns to Portsmouth June 20 through 29 and subscriptions and individual tickets are now on sale. Now in its sixth year, the festival brings 24 world-class musicians together to live, rehearse and perform a series of seven chamber music concerts over the span of just 10 days on the New Hampshire Seacoast.

Éach concert features a unique program and no two pieces of music are repeated across seven performances. Of particular note this year is Olivier Messiaen's eightmovement masterpiece, Quartet for the End of Time, which was written while he was a prisoner of war in Germany during World War II and was first performed by his fellow prisoners. The concluding piece of the final concert on Saturday, June 29 will be the transformative yet rarely heard septet version of Richard Strauss' pinnacle achievement for string orchestra, Metamorphosen.

New this year, a special free Children's Concert will be held on Wednesday, June 19 at 2 p.m. at the Portsmouth Public Library. The festival musicians, from institutions like New England Conservatory and New York Philharmonic, will also explain the history of the quartet genre and answer questions. The free educational opportunity is a preview of Halcyon Music Festival's sixth season.

"Each year our roster of world-class musicians evolves and this year we're particularly excited to welcome back recent Naumburg International Violin Competition winner,



Grace Park, who is a major celebrity in the classical music world right now," noted Heng-Jin Park, pianist and the Festival's Artistic Director. "We're also thrilled to be able to steal extraordinary Boston Symphony cellist Oliver Aldort for a week and to have violist and Portland Chamber Music Festival Artistic Director Melissa Reardon join us for the first time."

The full list of participating international virtuosos includes bassist Karl Doty; cellists Oliver Aldort, Alexei Gonzales, David Hardy, Thomas Kraines, Loewi Lin, Peter Stumpf; clarinetist Paul Cigan; pianists Lolita Lisovskaya-Sayevich and Heng-Jin Park; violinists Robyn Bollinger, Gabriela Diaz, Emma Frucht, Zenas Hsu, Irina Muresanu, Grace Park, Monica Pegis and Ben Sayevich; and violists Tim Deighton, Robert Meyer, Melissa Reardon, Lauren Siess, Jessica Thompson and Marcus Thompson.

Thursday, June 27: "Vienna in Portsmouth" featuring works by Mozart, Korngold and Schubert.

Friday, June 28: "The End of Time—And Back Again" featuring works by Wolf, Mozart and Messiaen.

Saturday June 29: "Transformations" featuring works by Shostakovich, Prokofiev, Schoenfield and Strauss.

All performances will be held at St. John's Episcopal Church in Portsmouth, NH at 7:30 p.m.

Audience members interested in attending more than one performance are encouraged to purchase one of the discounted subscription options: \$150 for the full festival; \$130 for six concerts; \$110 for five concerts; \$88 for four concerts; \$65 for three concerts.

South Carolina GRAMMY-nominated rock band NEEDTOBREATHE will perform at the Capitol Center for the Arts (Concord, NH) on Thursday, May 9, 2019 at 7:30PM. Opening for the band is Trent Dabbs. The show is jointly presented by the CCA and Kirschner Concerts.

NEEDTOBREATHE is comprised of brothers Bear Rinehart (vocals, guitar) and Bo Rinehart (guitar, vocals), Seth Bolt (bass, vocals), and Josh Lovelace (keys, vocals). Their album HARDLOVE released in 2016 and debuted at #1 on the Billboard Top Albums, Top Current Albums, Top Rock Albums and Top Alternative Albums charts and #2 on the Billboard 200, their greatest debut yet.





Famous art comes to The Rochester Museum of Fine Arts

The Rochester Museum of Fine Arts, in association with The Argh Gallery, is proud to announce a one-day-only exhibition featuring a genuine "LOVE" screen print signed by **Robert Indiana**. The event will take

place in the Bernier Room, at the Rochester Community Center, on Saturday, May 4th from 1-3pm. Light refreshments will be served. The public is



encouraged to attend. Robert Indiana (born Robert Clark; September 13, 1928 — May 19, 2018) was an American artist associated with the pop art movement. His "LOVE" print, first created for the Museum of Modern Art's Christmas card in 1965, was the basis for his 1970 "LOVE" sculpture and the widely distributed 1973 United States Postal Service "LOVE" stamp.

In 1994, Robert Indiana did a limited run of green "LOVE" prints to benefit the Greenpeace organization. Indiana personally gifted one of the prints to Sarah Knoy, director of the Greenpeace offices in Chicago, IL.

We are pleased to present a selection of works by **Tom Glover.** The exhibition will be on view in the

Tom Glover is an exceptionally talented painter and oil painting restorer. His work has been exhibited in a variety of venues and has received regional and national attention. Glover taught at the University of New Hampshire and teaches presently at Sanctuary

Arts in Eliot, Maine. He has also been an Artist in Residence on Appledore Island for the Shoals Marine Laboratory.

We are proud to present a special exhibition called "A Tribute to Sunday B. Morning" in the Art Gallery at the Rochester Performance & Arts Center. The exhibition will feature 4 of **Andy Warhol's** iconic Marilyn screenprint series. An opening reception will be held on Friday, May 31st from 5-7pm. Light

refreshments will be served. The public is encouraged to attend.

In 1967, Andy Warhol produced what would become one of the most iconic and



memorable representations of screen legend Marilyn Monroe. Warhol created a series of 10 variations in what is now referred to as the Marilyn series, each with virtually the same composition, but different color variations. These original prints are known as the "Factory Additions".

These are by far the most expensive Marilyn screenprints, which auction anywhere from \$100,000 for a single print, to over \$1.5 million for the suite.

After Warhol published his famous Factory
Additions of Marilyn, he began collaborating with two
anonymous friends from Belgium on a second series
of prints.

The original idea behind this partnership, for Warhol, was to play on the concept of mass production. He was essentially mocking the idea that the Factory Addition prints were somehow more important than the second series. Warhol provided the photo negatives

and color codes needed to create silkscreens exactly like the ones he had used for the Factory Additions.

In 1970, Warhol's original silkscreens were reproduced to create the second series of Marilyn screenprints. These were named "Sunday B. Morning" prints. Their dimensions are 36x36 and are printed with high quality archival inks, just like the originals.

Also pleased to present a selection of works by **Michael Phillips**. The exhibition will be on view in the Art Gallery, at the Rochester Performance & Arts Center. A reception will take place on Friday, May 31st from 5-7pm. Light refreshments will be served. The public is encouraged to attend.

Michael Phillips is a United States postal worker and self taught artist from Litchfield, New Hampshire, now based in Concord.

His work brings together various antithetical and contradictory sentiments, as well as a wide range of influences, techniques, and mediums, into a cohesive body of work that puts more stock in an oeuvre than singular pictures. He attempts to elevate and highlight

the accidental, overlooked, and non-art we pass every day: cracked city buildings, rusty metal, dirty walls, runny paint.



Phillips draws from his time as a

musician and brings the ideas and ethos of DIY music scenes to his art. He is relatively new the art scene but has shown in galleries in New Hampshire and is in private collections in Europe, Canada and across the IISA.




