#### New Boston welcomes Hailey Gelinas home after her kidney transplant

Hailey Gelinas, 18, of New Boston received a new lease on life thanks to a kidney transplant from an anonymous 20-year-old female donor, last week. This was the second kidney transplant she has received. Her first transplanted kidney was donated by her uncle in 2007, but was rejected in 2016.

Hailey's guardian, Elaine Gilman, does not have much information other than that there has been a marked improvement in Gelinas' health since the surgery. Gilman has also noticed that Gelinas' outlook has improved as dietary restrictions that prevented the young girl from eating many foods like spaghetti and broccoli have now been lifted. "She is feeling on top of the world, she hasn't stopped smiling since she woke up," said Gilman.

Upon returning to New Boston, Gelinas received an impromptu parade from the New Boston Fire Department. For years, Gelinas has been an honorary member of the New Boston Fire Department, just one

of the organizations in New Boston and Weare that Gilman says have been invaluable to help Gelinas persevere through her difficulties.

"Everyone is blown away in the fire department by her strength; she's one of the strongest people you'd ever want to meet. She has all these problems, but not once did she ever stop smiling, she keeps on fighting back," said New Boston Fire Department Chief Dan MacDonald.

#### Franklin's Mill City Park named "Project of the Year"

Mill City Park, the private/public partnership that wants to build on the Winnipesaukee River a first-of-its kind "community whitewater and outdoor park" in Franklin, is celebrating an eventful 2019. Five months ago, the New Hampshire chapter of the American Planners Association gave Franklin's whitewater park project its "Project of the Year" award. Last week, the

project received the same award from the Northern New England chapter.

Last Thursday, Franklin officials, including Executive Director of Mill City Park Marty Parichand, Mayor Tony Giunta and City Manager Judie Milner attended a presentation at the Omni Mount Washington Hotel to accept the award on behalf of Mill City Park and the city of Franklin.

Researchers have found that the anti-parasite drug benznidazole may improve the long-term prognoses of patients with chronic Chagas disease, according to a study published in *PLOS Neglected Tropical Diseases*. Caused by exposure to the protozoa Trypanosoma cruzi, Chagas disease is a leading cause of cardiopathy and death in Latin America. An estimated 5.7 million people in Latin America are infected with Chagas, yet few treatments exist.

and among known treatment options, specific therapeutic benefits are not well understood. Researchers in Brazil observed 1,813 patients who had tested positive for T. cruzi infection for two years, comparing clinical outcomes of those who had previously received benznidazole treatments with those who had not taken benznidazole. The authors found that Chagas patients treated with benznidazole while still in the early stages of disease had improved clinical and parasitological outcomes after a two-year follow-up period. Compared to the untreated group, researchers observed lowered mortality rates, lower parasite counts, and a lower risk of Chagas-related heart disease.

Results from a major clinical trial published in the *New England Journal of Medicine* may have direct implications for patients who remain at increased cardiovascular risk despite taking statin therapy. Icosapent ethyl reduced the risk of important cardiovascular events by 25 percent, including a 20 percent reduction in death due to cardiovascular causes, a 31 percent reduction in heart attack, and a 28 percent reduction in stroke. Icosapent ethyl is a prescription medication approved to reduce triglyceride levels in patients with very high triglycerides. Studies have suggested that icospant ethyl may have additional attributes such as anti-inflammatory and cell membrane-stabilizing properties that may also contribute to reducing cardiovascular risk.

## DENTAL CARIES AND DENTAL SEALANTS



Dr. Esin Narli-Trangari:

Although largely preventable, dental caries is one of the most common chronic diseases among children and adolescents. National data from 2011 through 2014 show that approximately 18% of children aged 6 to 11 and 58% of children aged 12 to 19 in the United States had treated or untreated caries in their permanent teeth. Disparities in caries preva-

lence exist across races and ethnicities and family income levels, and prevalence is highest among minority and socioeconomically disadvantaged populations. If left untreated, dental caries can cause pain, speech problems, and missed time from school.

About 90% of caries in permanent teeth occur in the posterior teeth. Dental sealants are widely recommended by professional health organizations because they prevent about 90% of posterior caries one year after placement and about 50% 5 years after placement. Prevalence of sealant use in children aged 6 to 11 rose 12.4 percentage points between the periods 1999–2004 and 2011–2014, from 31.1% to 43.6%. Children from low-income households (below 185% of the Federal Poverty level), however, are about 20% less likely to receive a sealant than children from higher-income households.

#### **H-D DECA hosts the Henniker Rotary Club**

#### Peterborough wants a Special Town Meeting

The Peterborough Select Board has petitioned the Hillsborough County Superior Court for permission to hold a special town meeting in January seeking voter approval of an additional \$781,000 over the town's May 2018 appropriations to fund the Main Street Bridge construction. The lowest responsible bidder on the project estimated the construction costs at \$6.596 million, plus another \$785,000 for contract administration, on-site observation and materials testing for a total cost of \$7.381 million. In May 2018, voters appropriated \$6.6 million. The town is requesting a special town meeting to allow voters to authorize the additional funding. Taxpayers will cover 20% of the total with the rest being federally funded.

#### Washington Elementary School Closed

The Washington Elementary School has been shut down after several people tested positive for the flu. School officials said Washington Elementary School was shut down Monday and canceled Tuesday because most staff members are sick. Several students reported being ill as well. "We felt it would be in the best interest of everybody, both teachers and students, to close the school for the day," said Superintendent Robert Hassett. Ten of the school's 45 students stayed home Friday with flu-like symptoms.

## Franklin vigil honors teenager murdered 48 years ago

A vigil was held in Franklin Friday night to honor the life of a teen murdered 48 years ago. Kathy Gloddy was found dead on November 22, 1971, and now her loved ones are asking for anyone with information to come forward.

Her family says it doesn't matter how many years have gone by, they will never stop looking for answers. "Just to remind people that we don't forget," said Janet Gloddy Young, Kathy's sister. The 13-year old left her neighborhood the day before she was found dead, saying she was walking downtown to the store and would be right back.


"That was the last time I saw Kathy," said family friend Lee Ann Beaupre Doucette. Police say the body was discovered the next day in the woods off Change Pond Road. She had been sexually assaulted, strangled, and suffered blunt force injuries to her neck, abdomen, and head. Her sister Janet wonders what Kathy's life could have been. "Is she married, did she have kids? I know she would've had a dog," she said.

The family accepted donations to the Franklin Animal Shelter in Kathy's memory. "Yes, because she loved animals. She wanted to be a veterinarian when she grew up," Gloddy Young said.

Earlier this year, Kathy's loved ones joined other advocates for victims of unsolved murders in the state, testifying for the need for more money for the cold case unit. The funding was ultimately approved in the state's budget. "Every day I think of her and hope and talk to her," said Gloddy Young. Anyone with information on the case should reach out to the Cold Case Unit at New Hampshire State Police.

## Missing New Boston man walks out of the woods safely

A 54-year old hunter who became lost in white-out conditions Sunday managed to make his way home safely on Monday.

Fish and Game Conservation Officers and family members began searching for James Allen of New Boston around 7:30 p.m. Sunday. He was reported overdue by his brother, Frank Allen.

"James was deer hunting in Warren by himself and should have been out of the woods by late afternoon," Fish and Game said in a news release. "Frank Allen reported that his brother was very familiar with the area and had been hunting in that area for many years. He also said his brother was wellequipped and had a very good sense of direction. It had rained throughout much of the day and snowed in late afternoon and evening."

Around midnight, James Allen found his way out of the woods "many miles from where he had started his hunt," Fish and Game officials said.

He walked several miles farther to the family home, where a family member alerted Fish and Game that he had made it out of the woods. James Allen told Fish and Game officers that he had tried to make his way to his vehicle around 3:30 p.m. Sunday.

He encountered heavy snowfall and white-out conditions and lost track of his direction.

"He eventually found a snowmobile

trail with a sign indicating it went to Warren," Fish and Game said in the news release. "He decided his best course of action at that time was to stay on the trail, which he knew would eventually bring him out of the woods and into the town of Warren."

evening at Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center in Lebanon. He was rushed there last Sunday after he suffered critical injuries in a crash on Route 101 in Peterborough on his way home from work, according to Chris Stawasz, regional director of AMR.

Murphy had just gotten off his shift at 2 p.m. Sunday and was driving home, still in uniform, when the crash occurred, according to Stawasz. Murphy was taken to Monadnock Community Hospital in Peterborough and then airlifted to Dartmouth-Hitchcock. Murphy's wife, Jenn, is also a full-time paramedic with AMR; the couple has four children between them, according to Stawasz.

Stawasz said Jenn Murphy "has asked me to convey her deep appreciation to everyone who has been so thoughtful and kind during this time."



We'll be laying out options and recommendations at a public meeting at 6:30 p.m. at Little Town Hall on December 3. Newport resident Bert Spaulding Sr. a frequent critic of the School Board, has filed a lawsuit claiming the board is ignoring a citizen petition Spaulding and others brought calling for a special school district meeting. Spaulding wants residents to vote on his proposal requiring the board to allow unlimited time for public comment, on relevant subjects, at meetings. He filed a federal civil rights action against the town in the 1990s after he was arrested for continuing to read from a legal opinion during a selectmen's meeting after he was told to stop.

#### Peterborough moves to dismiss lawsuit

Attorneys for the town of Peterborough have filed a motion to dismiss claiming the town did not need to provide evidence of alleged wrongdoing, nor did it need to provide due process when it fired former Recreation Director Jeffrey King. King is suing Peterborough in the Cheshire Superior Court, saying he was wrongfully fired in August after an accusation of harassment came forward and the town accused him of taking a "prurient" photo. The motion written by attorney Samantha Elliott says that King does not have the right to due process, nor to see the alleged evidence against him because he was working without a contract and New Hampshire is an "at will" employment state. King was fired in August, claiming King had been fired for failing to follow town policies, though the exact failings were never made clear.

#### **Sweethearts and Heroes at Center Woods**

Sweethearts and Heroes, an organization that devotes itself to addressing the impact bullying has on schools, neighborhoods, and individuals recently spent the day at Center Woods Upper Elemen-

tary and Weare Middle School. The two speakers from Sweethearts and Heroes, Tom Murphy and Rick Yarosh, presented an assembly for each school, visited classrooms, joined students



for lunch and one-on-one conversations, and held a professional growth session for teachers at the end of the day. This visit by the group was underwritten by the generosity of Northeast Delta Dental. The program for the Upper Elementary School used humor and role-playing to emphasize what bullying is and how to recognize it in all its forms. The Middle School assembly was more serious in tone and focused on empowering bystanders to help them find ways to make a difference.

The core of the Sweethearts and Heroes presentation is their five "Bully Buttons" that combine to form a call to action against bullying. Speaker Rick Yarosh, who is burned over most of his body from an IED injury in Iraq, gave a message about overcoming adversity and turning a negative situation into a positive one. "I am no hero, but with my experience, I can only hope to share what I've been through and make people understand that happiness is not far off." Eighth-grade student Travis Wiggin from the middle school commented about the program, "The assembly meant a lot to us. It was funny and relatable." Classmate Rebecca Mussey, also in 8th grade, added, "They made you put yourself in someone else's shoes and ask yourself if you'd want to be treated that way. Their message helps make the world a better place and keeps kids from losing hope."

It has been wonderful to see examples from some of our students becoming sweethearts and heroes," said WMS and CWUES Principal Shawne Hilliard. "Since the assembly, some students have become 'sweethearts' by showing kindness and finding ways to support others with positive comments. Others have been 'heroes' by standing with those who may have been treated poorly by their peers. This assembly went beyond the serious issue of bullying to empower our students to recognize the 'sweetheart' that gives hope and the 'hero' who takes action," concluded Mrs. Hilliard.







#### Effort to help domestic violence shelters become pet-friendly

An estimated 1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men will experience some form of domestic abuse in their lifetime. Escaping abusive situations and starting over in a new and safe environment is an overwhelming experience for victims, especially when pets are involved. An added challenge is that few (approximately 10 percent) domestic violence shelters in the U.S. accept and house pets. This leaves abuse victims with a difficult decision - flee to safety but leave their pet behind or stay with their abuser? Almost half of domestic violence victims choose to stay in an abusive situation out of fear of what might happen to their pet if they leave.

Pets provide unconditional love and comfort, demonstrate loyalty and devotion, and teach people about care and compassion. Pets can also sense when their owners experience sadness or pain, and their presence can provide comfort and promote healing.
