

Seacoast Science Center opens two new exhibitions: Restoring Reefs and NH Beaches

(Rye, NH) The Seacoast Science Center (SSC) has opened two allnew, highly interactive exhibitions, Restoring Reefs and NH Beaches. The

exhibits will help people understand the ecological importance of these habitats through engaging activity stations, live animal tanks, and interpretive programming. Restoring Reefs teaches about the



variety of natural reef systems that exist in our ocean and coastal waters. The exhibit features two 400-gallon living coral reef habitat tanks; one showcasing a healthy system with brilliantly colored fish and coral, and the other showcasing a stressed reef environment, demonstrating the effects of compromised ocean conditions.

Restoring Reefs includes a captivating clown fish tank, interactive video library, and an imaginative play station where visitors of all ages can explore the meaning of color at the reef and in their own lives. NH Beaches helps visitors gain a deeper appreciation and understanding of our coast; a place not only enjoyed by humans, but habitat to any array of wildlife whose well-being depends upon it being a healthy, balanced ecosystem. Upon entering the gallery, you experience the sights and sounds of the beach and are invited to sit on a small-scale lifeguard chair (a perfect photo-op!). A sand table, where imaginative play is encouraged, includes model animals and plants with codes, that when scanned, launch videos that dive deeper about the species and related conservation topics. Everyone can contribute to the My Happy Place mural to share their thoughts of what the beach means to them.

A 12-foot wave action tank puts visitors in control of the surf as they learn about coastal resiliency and the influence of different shoreline features. The Pollution Tank, which contains an array of litter and marine debris collected along the shore of Odiorne Point State Park over the course of a year, makes an impactful statement about human activity and ocean health. Restoring Reefs and NH Beaches were custom-designed and built by the Seacoast Science Center's education and exhibit staff and generously sponsored by NextEra Energy, Meredith Village Savings Bank, Partner's Bank, Ambit Engineering, Derry Medical Center, Lowery's Lawn and Patio, Riverworks Printing, Allen & Major Associates, Mark and Holly Adamy, and Mitchell and Kathryn Drew.

Great Glen Trails hosts youth cross-country skiing event

The New England Bill Koch League (NEBKL) strives to introduce youngsters to the lifelong sport of cross-country skiing, and all that it offers for recreational and social opportunities. The league promotes fitness and competitive challenges, but its main goal is to create a fun environment where children develop a true love for the sport. Named after Bill Koch, the first U.S. Olympic medalist in cross-country skiing, the NEBKL is the largest cross-country ski program for children in the United States, and is comprised of over 45 clubs throughout New England, with well over 800 youth participants and adult leaders.

Great Glen Trails Outdoor Center has hosted a BKL club for more than 15 years, lead by Olympian and ski school director Sue Wemyss. Sue has a passion for bringing youth into a sport that she truly loves, and dedicates her Sunday afternoons to club activities. All children in grades 1 through 8 are welcome to join, and no experience is necessary. The club meets weekly for about two hours, focusing on skiing activities that are fun and exciting, and competitions which encourage the kids to participate at the best of their respective abilities.

The highlight of the season—for kids and coaches, alike—is the annual New England Bill Koch League Festival. For 2020, the Festival is



being hosted by Great Glen Trails, much to the delight of its employees and the local cross-country skiing community. This two-day event will begin on Saturday, February 29, with a full schedule of races being held throughout the weekend. In addition to the multiple categories of races, the Festival will give kids a taste of ski jumping and biathlon, as well as fun activities such as snow tubing, obstacle courses, radar runs, ski tours, snowman building and face painting.

While most of the NEBKL clubs will be attending the Festival, you don't need to be a club member to participate. Registration is open to all kids in grades 1 through 8 who are looking for a fun weekend of winter activities and racing.
