# Sydney the Kidney

## Center Woods teacher donates her kidney to a colleague

A Weare woman has given the gift of life to a co-worker by donating her kidney. Jennifer Guillemette and Sherri Dyer are teachers who work across the hall from each other at Center Woods Elementary School in Weare.

Guillemette, who teaches preschool, went into kidney failure in February 2019 and was placed on the donor waiting list. That's when Dyer stepped in and offered to be tested to see if she was a match. The two had surgery two weeks ago at Massachusetts General Hospital. They both said they are feeling great.

Dyer said she didn't think twice about becoming a donor and would do it again if she could. "Something inside me was very compelled to do it, and honestly, I felt inside that it was going to happen, and I don't know why," Dyer said.

They named the kidney Sydney, and Sydney the Kidney is doing very well in Jen.

Last Friday was National Donor Day, and Guillemette and Dyer said they wanted to share their story to inspire someone else to donate an organ if they can.

## Missing Weare man's body discovered in Massachusetts

The vehicle of a missing an 89-year-old Weare resident was discovered last Friday, followed several hours later by his body. Massachusetts State Police do not suspect foul play in the death of Gerard Lemay, who was found outdoors near his Hyundai Accent, which was discovered in the parking lot of a waste incineration plant in Haver-



hill, MA. Lemay was last seen at his home in Weare on Tuesday at about 5 a.m.

At that point, New Hampshire State Police said he was seen wearing a blue flannel hooded sweatshirt, a green T-shirt, black shoes, and gold-rimmed glasses.

Lemay was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and dementia. Authorities are continuing to investigate the circumstances surrounding Lemay's death.

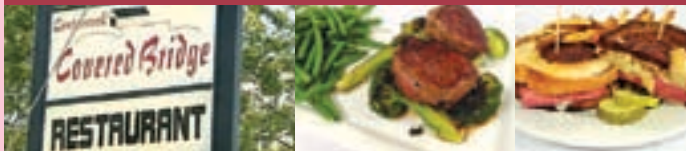



## Accomplice to Jeremy Charron's death violates parole



Kevin Paul, 40, an accomplice in the 1997 shooting death of Hillsborough's Jeremy Charron, then an Epsom Police Officer, walked away from a sober house last weekend.

Paul was paroled after a 2015 arrest on firearms charges and violating the condi-

tions of an earlier parole. That parole had been granted after Paul served time in prison as an accomplice in Charron's death. Paul, then 18, was riding in a car with Gordon Perry when Perry gunned down Charron.

After receiving several tips as to his whereabouts, members of the U.S. Marshals Fugative Task Force arrested Paul in Copperas, Texas. He is being held pending return to NH.

# Alabama lawyers seeking asbestos claims against Monadnock Paper Mills

An Alabama law firm is seeking out clients for a potential lawsuit against the Monadnock Paper Mills. Norris Injury Lawyers wants to identify cancer victims or the families of deceased victims who worked at the plant before 1981, in order to determine their eligibility for funds set aside by asbestos manufacturers as required by federal bankruptcy courts.

The law firm claims that asbestos-laced products were used for decades at at Monadnock Paper Mills, while neither the employees nor management were aware of

the dangers.

When contacted, officials at the Mill refused comment. According to the National Cancer Institute, "It can take from 10 to 40 years or more for asbestos-related cancers

to appear." Cancer victims or the families of deceased victims who worked at the plant before 1981 may call 800-478-9578 for a free evaluation of their claim. Additional information is available at [getnorris.com/asb](http://getnorris.com/asb).

## Letters to the Editor

### Dear Editor:

On Saturday, March 14, at Deering's Town Meeting, there will be an article asking townspeople to vote on whether they wish to retain the traditional town meeting where discussion and deliberation is held on each warrant article facing the town, with voting to follow during that meeting, or if they wish to replace the traditional town meeting with what is known as "SB2". With SB2, a deliberative session is held on a day prior, but all voting is done by ballot on the second Tuesday in March during polling hours. I have, over the years, changed my ideas about how voting on town matters can best be handled and I support switching to the SB2 form of voting by ballot. Here are my reasons:

First, Deering's town hall has a limit of, if I remember correctly, 125 persons being inside at any one time. This is a safety rule imposed by fire laws. The checklist of registered voters has averaged at around 1200 voters, meaning that of all the people who COULD vote on town matters, only a tenth could be allowed in town hall to deliberate and then vote. Traditional town meeting is a denial of the right of many Deering citizens to vote on matters affecting their taxes and other facets of living here.

The disenfranchisement continues because town meeting voting denies the opportunity to vote given to same day registration. Although registration with the Town Clerk and at Checklist meetings is possible, not all people are able to avail themselves of those opportunities. Further, those who work outside town on Saturdays, or are unable by age or disability to attend town meeting, are forced to forego having any say in the town decisions which greatly affect them. Ballot voting allows for Absentee Voting so these individuals can vote.

And further, I recorded a number of Town Meetings in which, during discussions and prior to a vote, there was an emergency call out of fire and/or police. These public servants often returned after to find they had lost their chance to vote on an issue.

Having the deliberative session tied to voting in the same meeting requires people to give up family activities, kids' sports, to devote a period of what often

can be three or more hours on a Saturday so that they are able to vote on town finances and issues.

The deliberative session of SB2 allows voters to decide if they wish to go for a discussion on the issues, or gather information in some other ways and choose their own methods for learning about the issues, then return during polling hours from 8 AM till 7 PM on voting day to cast their ballot.

Too often, traditional Town Meeting gives a forum for lengthy, and not necessarily informed, opinions to be expounded upon. For those who say informed decisions on voting can ONLY be reached at traditional town meeting, I point them in the direction of our town records. In the 1840s, successive town meetings weighed the matter of repairs to town hall. Finally, after two or three meetings when the repairs had been voted out, it was decided to form a committee to study the issue and bring it back to the next town meeting.

The committee appeared at that next meeting and informed the assemblage that YES, repairs are most definitely needed. At that point, the repairs were voted down as being too expensive to do. It was not until 2003 that a comprehensive repair of our town hall was approved by voters. So much for the infallibility of traditional town meeting!

One argument against SB2 is that, sometimes, towns having voted it in, the next year switch and vote it out. This argument does not hold much water. The ability to vote on ballot enabled people who really did not want SB2 to band together to ballot vote themselves back to Town Meeting. At a traditional meeting, they might still be arguing the matter back and forth.

So, I FULLY support Deering's adoption of SB2, and those who wish to have a say, Yea or Nay, should come to Town Meeting and vote on Article 11. I hope they will vote to adopt SB2, but where we will put all those who wish to vote, I have no clue. Deering Town Hall, nor any place else in Deering, can hold its voting public...Unless we switch to hold Town Meeting in May and all sit on the ground in the Hotel Lot across the street.

# Newbury voters again asked to support a \$3.75 million Fire Station

Newbury voters will be asked to support an Operating Budget of \$4,402,614 at Town Meeting on March 10th. Other spending items include \$296,000 to be placed in previously established capital reserve funds, including: Fire Equipment \$210,000, Highway Equipment \$75,000, Bridges and recreation facilities \$11,000.

An additional \$88,000 would be placed in expendable trust funds previously established, including: Docks \$10,000, Town Office Equipment \$15,000, Town Buildings \$35,000, Milfoil Control \$5,000, FD Personal Protection \$8,000 and Paving \$15,000, Article 8 class for \$270,000 to be used for covering expenditures for designing a new addition to the existing library.

\$39,500 is requested for the purchase of a new 2020 All-Wheel Drive Dodge Durango Pursuit rated police vehicle with \$9,850 coming from the undesignated fund balance.

Returning to the warrant is a \$3,750,000 request for the design and construction and the original equipping of a new Fire Department Building lo-

cated beside the Veteran's Memorial and related site work, and to authorize the

issuance of not more than \$3,750,000 of bonds or notes.

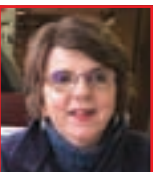

Install CO alarms near sleeping areas. Check heating systems and fuel-burning appliances annually. Avoid the use of non-vented combustion appliances. Never burn fuels indoors except in devices such as stoves or furnaces that are made for safe use. Be Attentive to possible symptoms of CO poisoning.

By: *Joyce Bosse* Other tips for preventing CO poisoning:

- Consider purchasing a vented space heater when replacing a non-vented one.
- Install and use an exhaust fan vented to the outdoors over gas stoves.
- Open flues when using the fireplace.
- Choose properly-sized wood stoves that are certified to meet EPA emission standards. Ensure wood stove doors fit tightly.
- Make sure all interior fuel-burning appliances are in good condition and have proper ventilation.
- Never idle the car in the garage, even if the garage door is open to the outside.
- Use portable generators outside and far away from buildings.
- Never use portable generators near sleeping areas.
- Never use a charcoal grill indoors, even in a fireplace.
- Propane heaters or heaters using other fuels placed in enclosed hunting and fishing shanties, should be vented to the outside.
- Never heat your home with a gas oven.

## ROOT CANAL WORK IS NOT AS BAD AS PEOPLE THINK

Root canal work is not as bad as people think when compared to other dental procedures. Self-reporting of their dental health suggests that patients find the procedure no worse than other dental work, which contradicts the popular belief that root canal work is the most unpleasant dental treatment.

Information about 1,096 randomly selected Australian people aged 30-61 was collected through questionnaires, dental records and treatment receipts in 2009. Their self-rated dental health score was checked when they had their dental work done, and again two years later.

Patients who had root canal work reported similar oral health-related quality of life as people who had other types of dental work.

The effect of root canal work on patients' oral health-related quality of life was compared to other kinds of dental work such as tooth extraction, restoration of teeth, repairs to the teeth or gum treatment, preventive treatment and cleaning.

Every year millions of root canal treatments are performed globally (more than 22 million in the USA alone), which may have a profound positive effect on the quality of life of patients. A root canal treatment repairs and saves a tooth that is badly decayed or is infected. During a root canal procedure, the nerve and pulp are removed and the inside of the tooth is cleaned and sealed. People often associate having root canal work with a lot of pain and discomfort, but as the study proved, that is simply not the case.

## TAKE YOUR MEDICINE

Taking a low-dose aspirin daily may help women lower their risk of developing ovarian cancer. A new study published in *JAMA Oncology* found that women who reported taking a low-dose aspirin every day had a 23 percent lower risk of ovarian cancer compared to nonaspirin users. The research also found that women who were heavy users of nonaspirin nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs), such as ibuprofen (Advil) or naproxen (Aleve), over a long period of time had a higher risk of developing ovarian cancer. Ovarian cancer is the most fatal gynecological cancer, largely due to lack of early detection strategies. The findings help confirm research published earlier this year in the *Journal of the National Cancer Institute*. The study, which used data pooled from 13 studies in the Ovarian Cancer Cohort Consortium, included more than 750,000 women, of which 3,500 were diagnosed with ovarian cancer. It found that daily use of aspirin reduced ovarian cancer risk by 10 percent. As many as 1 in 6 Americans takes antidepressants, mostly selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors. A new study published in *PLOS ONE* has found that SSRIs reduce the effectiveness of hydrocodone and codeine, which are often prescribed to patients who have recently undergone surgery. The finding could help combat the opioid epidemic, as poorly managed pain may lead to opioid abuse.

Proton pump inhibitors (PPIs), which include well-known brand names Prilosec, Nexium and Prevacid, are among the most commonly prescribed medications in the world. Approximately 10 percent of adults in the United States take these drugs for frequent heartburn, acid reflux and gastroesophageal reflux disease. In the study, published by *Scientific Reports*, researchers found that patients who took PPIs were more likely to experience kidney disease than people who took histamine-2 receptor antagonists, another form of acid that treats the same condition and includes the brands Pepcid and Zantac.

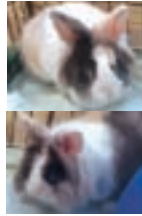

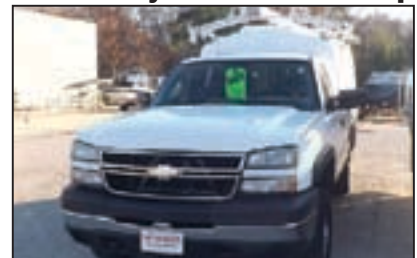
