Hillsborough upset with further delays of sidewalk extension project

The Engineers from Dubois & King had requested a meeting with the Hillsborough Select Board for Wednesday night. When Town Administrator Laura Buono e-mailed to remind them of the meeting, this is the reply received: "I am not prepared, and would not be presenting any new information to the Selectboard other than what you already know. I would be prepared to present to the Selectboard on the 28th with this new information."

Buono's response was direct and to the point: "That's unfortunate. We have met with you a couple of times with regard to this and unfortunately, there seems to be no urgency on your end although we have stressed the importance of this project. This meeting was set up a month ago with you and as you recall, I felt that Dubois and King should be reporting everything to the Selectmen in order to hear their thoughts and concerns. Both you and Mr. Tetreault know exactly how we

feel about these sudden changes and about our uneasiness with what has taken place, including the gaps in communication, since you have been assigned to our project. In fact, if you knew you wouldn't be ready for the meeting that we already scheduled, why didn't you contact me last Friday once you knew you wouldn't be pre-

pared? One would think that you both would understand by now the importance of this project, at least to us and our community.

I would appreciate if you or Mr. Tetreault would send me the name and contact information of the management above you so that I can communicate these issues to them."

Two newer groups of medications prescribed primarily for Type 2 diabetes treatment (SGLT2 inhibitors and GLP-1 receptor agonists) could significantly reduce risks associated with chronic kidney disease (CKD) and heart disease. Based on analyses of the clinical trials through March 2020, a group of leading experts in diabetes, heart failure, kidney disease and cardiometabolic disease believe the medicines should be considered for people with CKD and Type 2 diabetes

to protect against heart and kidney disease and their serious complications, according to a new Scientific Statement from the American Heart Association published in the AHA's journal Circulation.

Patients with plaque build-up in their arteries, who suffered a transient ischemic attack (TIA) or a minor ischemic stroke, also called a warning stroke, and were treated with the newer blood thinner ticagrelor (trade name: Brilinta) plus aspirin were 27% less likely to have another stroke within 30 days, according to late-breaking research published in *Stroke*, a journal of the American Heart Association.

Drugs to lower blood pressure of the type ACE inhibitors or angiotensin II receptor blockers reduce the mortality rate of influenza and pneumonia. This is the main conclusion of a reassuring new study published in the *Journal* of the American Heart Association. ACE inhibitors are a group of drugs which expand the blood vessels so that blood pressure is lowered and the work done by the heart becomes easier. An ACE inhibitor dampens the enzyme in the body which ensures that the inactive angiotensin I is converted into the active angiotensin II. Angiotensin II causes contraction of the blood vessels. When the body forms less angiotensin II, the blood vessels relax and blood pressure decreases. The acronym ACE stands for Angiotensin Converting Enzyme.

Accidents keep Hillsborough Police busy

On July 5th, Hillsborough officers responded to a crash on West Main Street at the top of Penstock Hill. This crash involved a motorcycle being operated by Nicholas Chamberland of Chichester and a Subaru Crosstrek being operated by Sarah Gladu of Hillsborough. The preliminary investigation revealed that Chamberland was operating at a high rate of speed and struck the rear of Gladu's car when he crested the hill. Chamberland sustained injuries from the crash. Investigation is still ongoing. Also on July 5th, officers were dispatched to another crash. Due to Hillsborough officers still investigating the first crash, Henniker PD responded to Bog Road for a single vehicle crash. The investigation showed that Dennis Giakoumis was operating a Ford Edge when he took his eye off the roadway briefly and struck a tree. Only minor injury was reported.

U.S. Space Force controls New Boston station

Monday's official ceremony unveiling the new sign completed the transfer of the New Boston Tracking Station from the U.S. Air Force to the U.S. Space Force Delta 6 - Space Access and Cyberspace Operations, headquartered in Colorado. The New Boston facility is one of a number of sites providing support to government and civilian satellites as well as some rocket flights, including private flights from Space X.

Hillsborough ZBA approves a variance and a special exception

Hillsborough's ZBA held a marathon 3-hour session of two Public Hearings Monday evening.

The first was an application by Scott Schulman for a Variance to allow the construction of a 3-car garage with 2nd floor office at the Pierce Lake waterfront house he just purchased at 10 Tasker Road. Richard Head from the Conservation Commission urged the Board to deny the request, saying it was not a hardship and impinged on the 75" lakefront setback. Nonetheless, the ZBA unanimously approved the variance subject to conditions.

A large crowd sat through that hearing waiting for the second, Kevin Mc-Cauley's request for a Special Exception to allow construction of a 34 unit RV Campground on 100 acres at Carr Road in the Rural Zone.

The proposal had been previously approved by the Planning Board subject to 26 conditions and had been rejected without prejudice by the ZBA, asking for more information.

Armed with new environmental and traffic studies, attorney Bob Kerry pointed out that the Master Plan specifically allows campgrounds in the Rural Zone, subject to a Special Exception.

Donna Hansen and Marian Baker led a list of several neighbors and abutters objecting to the project for a number of reasons, specifically that it was "out of character" for the area. Each presented petitions in opposition signed by several abutters.

After further discussion, the Board approved the Special Exception by a vote of 4-1 with member Meg Curtis objecting.

If you see them on the street or in the store, be sure to say "Thank You." That is the least they deserve.




Letters to the Editor

Bradford also considers a noise ordinance

At their recent meeting the Bradford Select Board was faced with a similar problem that many other area towns have recently encountered: a request for a noise ordinance. After much discussion with area resident Michael Malacha and Chief of Police James Valiquet the Board took no action at that meeting. The police will continue to monitor the area as at times the actions of the neighbors seem to rise to the level of harassment. However, Board Chair Andrew Pinard did say that he felt something should be done and that perhaps the Board could enact a temporary ordinance until next March when the entire Town could vote. Later in the meeting other residents spoke of excessive noise from a neighbor who appears to be doing business in a rural/residential area without Planning Board approval. The Board will direct the Code Enforcement Officer to check compliance and report back at the next Board meeting in two weeks. The Board also discussed Old Home Days with Park and Recreation Director Devon Pendleton. Since the fireworks were postponed from July 3 to September 25, Devon asked about the budget and ideas to make the entire event have more community involvement. It was suggested that town groups be contacted and a survey be put on the town's website.

Peterborough is assessing \$700,000 in fines

Peterborough is seeking to collect nearly \$700,000 in fines for more than a dozen building code violations at the Walden eco-village housing project. The town lists 15 town and state violations and asserts that it is entitled to \$275 per violation for the first day, and another \$550 per violation for each subsequent day. The owner is also being sued by former tenants, who were all forced out of their homes two weeks before Christmas because of the violations.
