# NH Librarian of the Year

# James A. Tuttle's Cynthia Jewett is the 2021 Honoree

The New Hampshire Library Trustee's Association has named Cynthia Jewett, Director of Antrim's James A. Tuttle Library, as the 2021 NH Library Director of the Year.

When she arrived, Jewett immediately confronted two formidable challenges: improving services and patron relations, and transforming Tuttle into a vibrant, 21st century library. She overhauled their lengthy "Policies and Bylaws" document so that the current operations reflect national, state, and local government mandates. She initiated professional development programs for all staff members. She assigned each employee specific areas of responsibility, but has also cross-trained the staff to fill other jobs if needed. She increased circulation from 16,409 items during 2017 to 21,490 during 2019.

Each year Jewett hosts more than

100 programs, many of which center on children, while Adult programs have included lectures on solar eclipses, bats, meteorology, and haunted hikes in the Granite State.

She created Friends of the Library, an organization missing in the past, and has worked closely with community partners, such as the Antrim Community Board, Avenue A, the Grapevine, the public school, the Antrim Historical Society, Antrim's Eclectic Book Club, the Antrim Anti-Racism Study Group, and the Great Decisions group.

In making the presentation, Marcia McLaughlin, president of the NH Library Trustees Association referred to Jewett as "The Energizer Bunny" for all her work in restoring and transforming the library, and could not imagine a more meritorious nominee to be NH State Library Director of the Year.

# Kearsarge seeking a \$22.3 million high school redesign and renovation bond

Kearsarge Superintendent Winfried Feneberg briefed the New London Select Board and Budget Committee on the need for a \$22.3 million redesign, renovation and construction bond at the 50 year old Regional High School. Feneberg stressed that only 75% of students are enrolled in a traditional post secondary curriculum, leaving 25% without proportion for their post high school life.

The project will include a S.T.E.A.M. Wing designed to improve teaching of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math.

The focus will be on hands on, project based learning, not just from books. Courses will include; Computer science, Robotics, Digital Photography, Graphic Design and Culinary Arts.

Needed maintenance projects include a new roof and improved HVAC at the school, in conjunction with 60,000 sq. ft. of new construction.

Feneberg said that the only additions

to staff would be one new art teacher and perhaps additional custodial help.

Officials are looking at a 20-25 year bond with current interest rates around 2%. The proposal will be presented to voters at the Deliberative Session in January and ballot voting in March, requiring a 3/5 vote. If approved the project would begin in July of 2023, with completion in September of 2024.


# Help the Hillsboro Lions Club feed our needy neighbors this holiday season

# Henniker accepts \$311,372 grant to build a cell tower on Craney Hill

At Tuesday's meeting the Henniker Select Board accepted a \$311,372 grant from the NH Department of Safety division of Homeland Security for a communication tower and building on top of Craney Hill.

The town is committed to improving communcation between fire, police and highway personnel, and this grant provides opportunity to improve and expand communication in town.

This grant is important to the Henniker community, but has a far wider impact. The tower will also house equipment for Capital Area Mutual Aid Fire Compact and the Merrimack County Sheriff's Office. After its completion it will result in better dispatching and incident management throughout Merrimack County and the Town of Henniker.

Rescue Squad Chief Greg Aucoin reported that it has been challenging to get per diem employees to work on holidays, and suggested that of-

fering holiday pay rates would help create an incentive to fill these open shifts. Section 4 of the Henniker Personnel Policies states permanent employees that are required to work on a holiday are paid at time and one half of their regular wage. The Board unanimously agreed.

# Three H-DHS DECA students qualify for International Competition

# The team finished #1 in the North Atlantic Region

After two weeks of competing against other high schools in a global competition, one team of students from Hillsboro-Deering High School has qualified for the DECA International Conference in April 2022.

In the Virtual Business Restaurant Management Competition, three students, senior Emily Wilkens, and Juniors Manny Velazquez and Emma Davison finished in first place in the competitive North Atlantic region of DECA and also sixteenth worldwide. They will join teams from New York, North Carolina, Texas, California, and Alberta, Canada.

These first round competitors will be combined with the winners of the January qualifier into a field of 16 teams competing for top world honors next spring at the International CDC in Atlanta, Georgia.

"It is one of the most stressful, yet fun times of the year. Students love competing against and connecting with

competitors from around the country and world to do this. The competition is intense and the students do a great job. I'm very proud of all the competitors. We had several students compete in all seven of the challenges. Our Retail team, Sports Management team, and Personal Finance team, just missed out on qualifying. It was a heartbreaker for them, but they have another shot at it in January," said H-D DECA advisor Marc Payeur.





Dentistry has come a long way from the days of George Washington and his wooden choppers. One of the best ways to replace a missing tooth or teeth these days is with a dental implant. What's implanted is a pin, usually made of titanium, and it goes into your jaw. It acts as a replacement root to support an artificial tooth.

Dr. Esin Narli Implants are generally preferable to dentures in that they

don't slip. That makes talking and chewing easier. Inserting the pin is a procedure normally done under local anesthesia. Not everyone, however, is a candidate for an implant. For one thing, you have to have sufficient bone in the jaw to support the implant. If you don't have enough bone, under some conditions the dentist might be able to graft bone.

Gum condition is also a consideration when determining if someone is a viable candidate for an implant. Even if you have implants, you'll want to continue regular visits to the dentist. For one thing, the dentist will want to check regularly on the condition of the implant and of the tissue in the immediate area of the work. For instance, tissue near the implant might not receive as much blood flow as tissue elsewhere in your mouth, and therefore could be more susceptible to infection. Talk with your dentist about whether you're a candidate for an implant.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has approved Orgovyx (relugolix) for the treatment of adult patients with advanced prostate cancer. It's the first oral drug in this class and it may eliminate some patients' need to visit the clinic for treatments that require administration by a health care provider. The American Cancer Society estimates that in 2020, there will have been more than 190,000 cases of prostate cancer in the U.S.

One of the treatment options for advanced prostate cancer is androgen deprivation therapy, which uses drugs to lower levels of the hormones that help prostate cancer cells grow. Current FDA-approved treatments of this type are injected or placed as small implants under the skin. Orgovyx is an orally administered treatment that works by blocking the pituitary gland from making hormones called luteinizing hormone and folliclestimulating hormone, thereby reducing the amount of testosterone the testicles are able to make.

Vitamin D is a critical nutrient and has many important functions in the body. A mother's vitamin D supply is passed to her baby in utero and helps regulate processes including brain development. A study published in The Journal of Nutrition showed that mothers' vitamin D levels during pregnancy were associated with their children's IQ, suggesting that higher vitamin D levels in pregnancy may lead to greater childhood IQ scores. The study also identified significantly lower vitamin D levels among Black pregnant women. Vitamin D deficiency is common among the general population as well as pregnant women, but Black women are at greater risk. The authors hope the study will help health care providers address disparities among women of color and those who are at higher risk for vitamin D deficiency.

"I Applied Day," is part of New Hampshire's I Am College Bound: I Applied campaign that assists high school seniors with navigating the college admissions process.


In support of I Applied, colleges and universities around the state waive application fees for students who submit applications during the

# Hillsboro-Deering Board sets basketball game protocols

**HD High School Principal James** O'Rourke and Middle School Principal Mark Peterson approached the School Board with recommendations for the 2021-2022 basketball games.

After discussing protocols with other school districts, the recommendations include having all fans able to attend games, have no concessions, have no entrance fees and all people not on the floor must wear masks. Those people on the floor (players and referees) have the option of wearing or not wearing masks. Right now there will be a full schedule with other schools; however, if COVID numbers rise there

may be a reduction of the team schedules and a change in protocols.

Both principals agreed that HYAA and the elementary school teams should abide by the same rules while using school property. Board member Heidi Welch questioned whether the Junior Class would be able to raise money for their prom as the concessions sold at basketball games had previously been earmarked for that class. Principal O'Rourke said it would, but hopefully they would be able to raise money another way. The Board agreed and voted to adopt the recommendations.


# Goffstown man arrested for resisting arrest




# Smith Memorial Church of Hillsborough launches a Go Fund Me page


