Improvements to Whipple Town Hall necessitate change

The New London Board of Selectmen will meet at the Kearsarge Professional Development Center (the same place where voting was held last week) on Thursdays for the next few months as improvements to Whipple Town Hall are completed.

Meeting at the Professional Development Center will allow the use of microphones which will greatly enhance the ability of members of the public, and the Selectmen, to hear what is being said. Installation of the audio-visual equipment in Whipple has been delayed due to supply change delays but the Selectmen are hopeful that the space will be ready soon. Upcoming meetings are Thursday, March 31st, April 14th and 28th. Check the calendar on the town.

Some of the improvements already made to Whipple include window shades, acoustic tiles on the walls and video monitors. This phase of the upgrades should be completed in May when the microphones, video and sound system are installed. Attending Selectmen's meetings, as well as other town board meetings, will be a lot less frustrating when everyone can hear what is being said. Thank you for your patience. The next phase will be the renovations that were approved at Town Meeting that will include new chairs and tables, lighting, electrical upgrades, painting, sprinkler system, air conditioning, storm windows, roof repairs and other maintenance issues. Once completed, Whipple will be an effective place to hold meetings and social events.

Colby-Sawyer College's new home for its School of Nursing & Health Sciences

Colby-Sawyer College is set to receive \$1.5 million in federal funding to support the construction of a new home for its School of Nursing & Health Sciences. The \$1.5 million, allocated as part of the 2022 government funding legislation signed into law last week, is among more than \$62 million being directed toward New Hampshire-based projects. These funds bring the college's total amount raised for the \$10.5 million project to \$7.9 million.

Colby-Sawyer President Susan D. Stuebner said, "A new home for the School of Nursing & Health Sciences will ensure that Colby-Sawyer is prepared to meet changing trends in healthcare education well into the future while also addressing the immediate workforce needs of healthcare providers both locally and across the country." Colby-Sawyer College announced earlier this month plans to construct a new \$10.5 million, 20,500 square foot facility for its School of



Nursing & Health Sciences on its New London, NH campus. The building will help accommodate growing enrollment within its undergraduate nursing and health sciences programs and integrate state-of-the-art technology into its classrooms and laboratories. Construction is slated to begin next year with an anticipated opening set for 2024.



Hopkinton approves school budget, new contracts for teachers and support staff

Hopkinton School District voters gathered in the gymnasium at Hopkinton Middle High School on Saturday for the 2022 Annual Meeting. The proposed \$22,553,797 Operating Budget was up 2.6% over the current \$21,973,387. The principal increases were in employee health insurance, higher contributions to the state retirement system and payment on a building project bond. It was approved with little discussion and no debate.

Voters also approved a new threeyear contract with the Hopkinton Education Association, which reflects an increase of \$393,082 in year one, \$364,498 in year two and \$350,189 the third year.

A two-year contract with the Hopkinton Educational Support Staff also passed. It carries an increase of \$122,889 next year and \$60,818 in year two. \$200,000 was added to the district's building repair and maintenance fund, from the undesignated fund balance.

Voters also established a new \$200,000 trust fund, specifically for employee benefits, and added \$100,000 to a special education trust fund, to cover unexpected future costs. Finally, voters also passed a proposal to add \$25,000 to a technology trust fund in case it's needed in the future.





Planning Board approves live music at Hillsboro House of Pizza and Bar

At the recent Hillsborough Planning Board meeting Susanne White was elected Chair and Melinda Gehris Vice Chair. Susanne then announced a letter of interest from resident Kim Opperman to become an alternate as there was an open position. The Board unanimously agreed and welcomed Opperman to the Board.

Steven and Carrolle Miller appeared before the Board for an Exemption for Site Plan Review in order to allow them to rent their jacuzzi on their deck as a Therapy Spa. The Board approved their request with the conditions that they have a safety inspection by the Code Enforcement Officer as well as to comply with all State and Federal rules and regulations.

After a Public Hearing the Board approved a Site Plan Amendment/ Change of Use to allow Hillsboro House of Pizza and Bar to have live music on their patio with conditions. They will be allowed to have no

PARESTHESIA



"Pins and needles" is one way to describe the sensation of paresthesia. It is a combination tingly, numb sensation that occurs most commonly in the hands and feet. We often say our limbs are "falling asleep."

But the sensation can also occur around the mouth in the form of numbness in the chin, lip, tongue or cheek. It may

set in after a dental procedure that requires anesthesia. Most commonly, it will occur in the lower jaw after removal of a wisdom tooth. It can happen after any difficult tooth extraction, and occasionally after even a relatively routine, non-surgical procedure.

Paresthesia is generally a temporary condition, but it's been known to continue for weeks, even months. Because it causes a loss of feeling the lip or tongue, paresthesia can lead to drooling and the accidental biting of the tongue and lips. It can also affect the ability to taste and to assess temperature sensations in the mouth.

Usually the cause for the onset of paresthesia is damage to one or more nerves, usually the mandibular, or lower-jaw, nerve. Some studies have found that the condition may also be brought on by the particular type of anesthesia used in a surgical dental procedure. TAKE YOUR MEDICINE



Nearly every older adult was prescribed a prescription drug that increased their risk of falling in 2017, according to new research. The study, published in *Pharmacoepidemiology and Drug Safety*, found that the percentage of adults 65 and older who were prescribed a fall-risk-increasing drug climbed to 94% in 2017, a significant leap from 57% in 1999. The research also revealed that the rate of death caused by falls in older adults more than doubled during the same time period. Even minor falls

doubled during the same time period. Even minor falls may be dangerous for older adults. Falls that are not fatal can still result in injuries — such as hip fractures and head traumas — that may drastically lower remaining quality of life. Fall-risk-increasing drugs include antidepressants, anticonvulsants, antipsychotics, antihypertensives (for high blog pressure), opioids, sedative hypnotics, and benzodiazepines (tranquilizers such as Valium and Xanax), as well as other nonprescription medications. From 1999-2017, more than 7.8 billion fall-risk-increasing drug orders were filled by older adults in the United States. The majority of the prescriptions were for antihypertensives. However, there was also a sharp rise in the use of antidepressants, from 12 million prescriptions in 1999 to more than 52 million in 2017. Women were also found more likely than men to be prescribed fall-risk-increasing drugs, particularly Black women, who received the medications at the highest rate compared to women of other races. White women who were 85 and older experienced the largest increase in deaths from falls, rising 160% between 1999 and 2017.

Close adherence to low-dose aspirin regimen led to better pregnancy outcomes in women with previous pregnancy losses who were trying to conceive. The beneficial effect of aspirin was stronger if women began taking it before pregnancy and weaker if they started taking it after the 6th week of gestation. This per protocol analysis of a randomized controlled trial is published in *Annals of Internal Medicine*.







Antrim groups working to construct a gazebo in honor of Don Dunlap

Antrim may soon have a new gazebo. The Trustees of the James A. Tuttle Library and the Antrim Historical Society are currently selling commemorative bricks for a gazebo project in honor of Don Dunlap. The project includes funds donated in his name when he died in 2019.

Both committees were unsure on how best to honor him, until Wood drove by Bennington's gazebo, and freely admits that he stole the idea to build one in Antrim.

The bricks will be used to create a walkway from the library to the gazebo, and perhaps surround the gazebo, depending on how many are sold.

The cost of the project will be covered by donations as well as other funds that both committees have at their disposal. Money raised by the bricks will be used to cover any extra costs, or for future library and historical society programming.

The smallest brick size will








