Chief David Cahill Retires

Served 35 years in law enforcement, 20 as Sunapee chief



After a distinguished law enforcement career spanning more than three decades, Sunapee Police Chief David P. Cahill has announced his retirement, effective May 31, 2022.

Chief Cahill was ap-

pointed Sunapee's Chief of Police in May 2002. He has played an integral role in fulfilling the department's mission to protect and serve our residents and implementing new technology to better serve our community. Moreover, he has been a strategic and thoughtful leader for the Sunapee Police Department. His commitment to working with the community to

increase transparency, accountability, and partnership has been exemplary.

Chief Cahill was a president of the New Hampshire Association of Chiefs of Police and was also a member of the New Hampshire Police Standards and Training Council. In 2017, Governor Sununu appointed Chief Cahill Chairman of that council. Before coming to Sunapee, Chief Cahill spent 13 years with the Hillsborough Police Department and achieved the rank of Detective Sergeant. He also worked undercover with the New Hampshire Attorney General's Drug Task Force.

Chief Cahill started his career in 1987 as a Bradford Police Officer, where he served the Town of Bradford for 2 years.

Deering reconstitutes Fire Department Study Committee

Deering Fire Chief Jeff LeBlanc explained that the 2015 study showed deficiencies within the town's fire equipment and explained that at some point soon the town will need to investigate revamping the town's fire stations. He proposed a five-member committee with one being the Town Administrator, three from the fire department, and a community member. The board would like one representative to be from the Select Board, namely Roy Watson.

Senator Ruth Ward recognized Stoddard boy as NH Kid Executive Councilor

Franz Haase, a 5th-grade student at James Faulkner Elementary, an SAU 24 elementary school in Stoddard, NH, was elected an Executive Councilor as a finalist in the NH Kid Governor contest earlier this year. This week Ruth Ward from the NH State Senate visited the school to recognize Franz. Franz's platform for the contest was "Addressing Childhood Poverty in New Hampshire." His campaign for NH Kid Governor including his campaign video was supported by all his fifth-grade classmates and their teacher, Amanda Bridges. This is the third vear in a row that James Faulkner Elementary has had a student finalist in the NH Kid Governor program.

New Hampshire's Kid Governor is a national civics program for 5th graders created by the Connecticut Democracy Center. The program immerses students in learning about state government, elections and voting, and civic participation through a real-life election. Students research

community issues they care about, create three-point platforms to address those issues, and make campaign videos. Schools run primaries to select nominees, and each school's winner advances to the Statewide Election. In November, 5th graders evaluate the online campaign videos of the final seven candidates and cast

their votes for the student and platform they support as NH Kid Governor. The student receiving the most votes serves a one-year term of leadership and advocacy, working to fulfill their campaign platform and mobilize students to take action and make a difference on the winning campaign issue.

Weare celebrates the 250th Anniversary of the Pine Tree Riot

The spark that led to Revolutionary War By Tom Thomson, Orford, N.H.

The Pine Tree Riot happened on April 14, 1772 in the town of Weare, N.H. on the site where the Quimby Inn once stood.

As early settlements grew and moved from the coast inland, the plentiful and valuable resource, our trees, became more important for landowners.

In the late 1600s England realized they had over cut their own forest to the point they were unable to provide the large trees to serve as masts for the wooden sailing ships of King George III's Royal Navy.

So the King claimed all the White Pine trees in the new colonies that were over 24 inches in diameter now belonged to the King of England and were to be cut and shipped back to England for his Royal Navy as they made superior masts for his ships. But in 1722 the British Parliament and the King passed a law to reduce the size of the White Pine trees they would call their own from 24 inches to 12 inches in diameter to be sure they had a continuous supply of White Pine masts for future Royal Navy ships.

When Benning Wentworth was colonial governor of New Hampshire he did very little to enforce the King's pine tree laws. But in 1766 John Wentworth (Benning's nephew) became governor and began to enforce the King's pine tree laws by sending out surveyors to check the sawmills in Goffstown and Weare and measure

the diameter of white pine logs. They found pine logs from 15" to 36" in diameter and claimed they were the King's property. The mill owners were fined and were ordered to pay them by February 7, 1772.

The sawmill owners of Goffstown paid their fines to get the logs back, but the sawmill owners in Weare did not. On April 13, Sheriff Whiting and Deputy Quigly rode into South Weare with a warrant to arrest sawmill owner Ebenezer Mudgett, who was the leader of the Weare mill owners. By the time they found Mudgett it was dark, and Mudgett agreed to meet the sheriff and deputy the following morning. They were staying at the Quimby Inn.

Mudgett and others met the sheriff and deputy in the morning and decided enough was enough of the King taking more and more. They would take a stand; they did not pay the fine and ran both royal officials out of Weare.

Early in the morning Mudgett and others surprised Sheriff Whiting and Deputy Quigly in their rooms, pulled them out of bed, whipped them, and took them outside where their horses were waiting with their manes and tails sheared off. Both were forced onto their horses and run out of the town of Weare.

Ebenezer Mudgett and other loggers and sawmill owners stood up and rebelled against the King's "Pine Tree Laws" which encouraged others to stand up and push back. This became the spark that one year later fueled the Tea Party in 1773 and then the Revolutionary War against Great Britain in 1775, also know as the American War of Independence, which started in Weare by a few proud, hard working folks like Ebenezer Mudgett and others who decided to rebel against the King's outrageous laws.

Bennington man indicted on 10 counts of possession of child pornography

Jonathan Ledoux, 23, of Bennington, has pleaded not guilty to 10 felony counts of child pornography after being found in possession of child sexual abuse images. He has been released on personal recognizance after his arrest by the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office in December 2020. As part of his release, the court ordered Ledoux to have no contact with children under the age of 16, the court documents state.

In an affidavit, Nashua Police Detective Adam Rayho wrote that the investigation into Ledoux was prompted by a cyber tip from Microsoft in August 2020 reporting a Skype user who had uploaded a file believed to be child pornography.

After the U.S. Department of Homeland Security traced the IP address used to upload that image to Ledoux's home, Rayho conducted a voluntary interview with Ledoux during which Ledoux admitted to possessing nude images and videos on his cellphone of children engaging in sexual acts.

Ledoux was indicted on charges of

possession of child sexual abuse images on March 22, 2022, and pleaded not guilty to the charges.

Henniker Police report that on March 28th, Emily Hadley of Bennington was traveling westerly on 202/9 in the area of Keyser Pond when the vehicle struck the west bound guard rail, crossed the roadway crashing through the east bound guardrail, coming to rest approximately 30 feet down the embankment. Scofield sideswiped Holbrook's vehicle, barely avoiding a direct head on collision. Holbrook was transported to the hospital with unknown injuries, the child was checked at the scene and not transported. Scofield was medically cleared at the scene. Scofield was arrested for Reckless Operation and Inhaling Toxic Vapors for Effect. He was PR bailed for court on May 3, 2022.

Stoddard man collides with a school bus

New Hampshire State Police have charged a local man with operating under the influence following a collision with a school bus Tuesday afternoon. State Police said 18 students were on the bus when Steven M. LaCroix, 61, allegedly struck it from behind on Route 123 near the town fire station. Damage to the bus was minimal. LaCroix's 2018 Cadillac XTS may have been involved in an earlier accident on Route 9 in Keene, police said in a statement. Police charged LaCroix with aggravated DUI, conduct after an accident, negligent operation and open container in a motor vehicle. He was released on his own recognizance and told to appear for arraignment in Keene District Court on April 13.

Hillsborough ZBA approves variances for 84 unit housing project

Representatives of Avanru Development met with the Hillsborough ZBA seeking two variances to allow their mixed use project of West Main Street.

The project consists of two, 14,500 sq. ft, 42 unit affordable housing units and one commercial building. Before going to the Planning Board,

the project requires variances; 1. To permit a multifamily residential use in the commercial zone, and 2. To allow a reduction of the required road frontage from 600' to 324'.

The 3+ hour hearing began with an agreement by the Zoning Board that Hillsborough needs workforce housing, with current rental vacancy at less

than 1%. Questioning focused on the location and scope of the project.

In the end, the multifamily variance was approved on a 4-1 vote with John Segedy opposed. The road frontage variance was unanimously approved 5-0, as was approval of the overall project which will now go before the Planning Board.

Glucosamine supplements may reduce overall mortality about as well as regular exercise does, according to a new epidemiological study from West Virginia University published in the Journal of the American Board of Family Medicine. Researchers assessed data from 16,686 adults. After controlling for various factors — such as participants' age, sex, smoking status and activity level — the researchers found that taking glucosamine/chondroitin every day for a year or longer

was associated with a 39 percent reduction in all-cause mortality. It was also linked to a 65 percent reduction in cardiovascular-related deaths. That's a category that includes deaths from stroke, coronary artery disease and heart disease, the United States' biggest killer.

For decades, the power of the placebo effect was thought to lie in patients' belief that they were — or at least, could be — receiving a pharmacologically active treatment. A new study suggests that patients don't need to be deceived to receive benefit from treatment with placebo. In a randomized clinical trial published in the journal PAIN, researchers found participants with moderate to severe irritable bowel syndrome (IBS) who were knowingly treated with a pharmacologically inactive pill — referred to as an honest or open-label placebo — reported clinically meaningful improvements in their IBS symptoms. People who received the openlabel placebo experienced improvements that were significantly greater than those reported by participants assigned to a no-pill control group. There was no difference in symptom improvement between those who received open-label or double-blind placebos. The results build on the research team's previous findings and challenge the long-held notion that concealment or deception are key elements in the placebo effect.

COVID-19 INFECTION RATES OF ENTISTS REMAIN LOWER THAN HER HEALTH PROFESSIONALS



More than a year after COVID-19 appeared in the U.S., dentists continue to have a lower infection rate than other front-line health professionals, such as nurses and physicians, according to a study published online ahead of the June print issue in the Journal of the American Dental Association. The study, "COVID19 among Dentists in the U.S. and Associated Infection Control: a six-month longitudinal study," is based on data collected June 9 - Nov. 13, 2020.

According to the study, based on the number of dentists with confirmed or probable COVID-19 infections over more than six months, the cumulative infection rate for U.S. dentists is 2.6%. The monthly incidence rate varied, ranging from 0.2% to 1.1% per month. By comparison, in June 2020, the cumulative COVID-19 prevalence rate for other U.S. health professionals ranged from 3.3% (Chicagobased hospital physicians) to 35.3% (U.S. based emergency medicine services).

"We're pleased to see that dentists have demonstrated continued low monthly incidence of disease despite several regional and national COVID-19 rate spikes during the study period," said American Dental Association (ADA) Science and Research Institute Chief Executive Officer Marcelo Araujo, D.D.S., M.S., Ph.D., the senior author of the report.

Dr. Araujo added, "This study shows high rates of pre-appointment screening of patients and appropriate infection control measures throughout the study period, demonstrating that adhering to very strict protocols for enhanced infection control helps protect their patients, their dental team and themselves."
