

The Grapevine's Avenue A is featured in documentary film

"Community, Belonging, Place," a documentary-style short film about teens in the Monadnock Region premieres at the Peterborough Community Theatre on Tuesday, June 7, at 7 p.m. Created by the NH Children's Trust in partnership with The Grapevine Family and Community Resource Center, the film celebrates local teens, their hopes for the future, what community means to them, and why places like The Grapevine's Avenue A Teen Center matter.

"We often talk about our teens as if they were a problem to solve," says Nathan Fink, NH Children's Trust Director of Advancement. "In reality they are a foundational part of any community. That's why it was important to partner with Avenue A and The Grapevine for this project. If our teens are supported and valued, our communities are stronger and more resilient."

The NH Children's Trust visited the Monadnock Region in March 2022 to create the short film, which features seven middle and high school students. Over several days, the film crew met with the teens and captured their activities, interests, and favorite local spots.

Partnering with the NH Children's Trust to highlight local youth was a natural fit for The Grapevine. "Supporting and encouraging teens - their interests, passions, and goals is key to growing them into healthy, positive adults," explains Melissa Gallagher, The Grapevine's Executive Director.

Avenue A is part of The Grapevine's two-generation approach to supporting youth. "This approach to family support means wrapping around the whole family: parents/ caregivers and their children together," Gallagher says.

For Donovan, a teen featured in the film, this project matters because, "The youth in a community represent its vitality, and the life it has yet to live. We represent life in the moment, and the future that we can build together."

The premiere is free and will

include a panel discussion with teens who are featured in the film. Attendees will be entered to win door prizes made by local teens. The event kicksoff Avenue A's NH Gives fundraiser, a statewide 24-hour online day of giving happening June 8-9.

As a program of The Grapevine Family & Community Resource Center, Avenue A is a regional Teen Center based in Antrim. Avenue A serves youth from more than 14 towns in the Monadnock Region with programs that build resilience through creative expression, social development, wellness, and career-skill building. With the help of 70 mentor-volunteers, Avenue A supports over 300 teens.

POOR ORAL HEALTH MAY IMPACT COVID-19 SEVERITY, ESPECIALLY FOR CARDIAC PATIENTS



According to a new study, the correlation between poor oral health and COVID-19 severity, as well as the correlation between oral health and delayed recovery, demonstrates a potential need to consider oral health an additional risk factor for cardiac patients who may contract COVID-19.

The oral cavity is a potential reservoir for respiratory pathogens.
Previous trials have linked poor oral hygiene with increased in-

flammation and cardiovascular disease. According to the researchers, COVID-19 severity has also been linked to an inflammatory response.

The researchers hypothesized that increased COVID-19 severity may be linked to poor oral health status, especially in patients with cardiovascular diseases. According to the study authors, the study assessed oral health status, severity of COVID-19 symptoms, C-reactive protein (CRP) levels and duration of recovery.

"Oral tissues could act as a reservoir for SARS-CoV-2, developing a high viral load in the oral cavity. Therefore, we recommended maintenance of oral health and improving oral hygiene measures, especially during COVID-19 infection," said Ahmed Mustafa Basuoni, MD, cardiology consultant at Cairo University and lead author of the study. "Simple measures like practicing proper oral hygiene, raising awareness of oral health importance either in relation to COVID-19 infection or systemic diseases by using media and community medicine, regular dental visits, especially in patients with CVD, and using [antimicrobial] mouthwashes [could help in] preventing or decreasing the severity of COVID-19 disease."

TAKE YOUR MEDICINE



A new study published in *Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews* has highlighted that there is very little evidence on safe and effective approaches to discontinuing treatment of depression. In 2020 there were 78 million prescriptions for antidepressants in England alone and about half of patients treated have taken them for at least two years. Guidelines typically recommend that antidepressants be taken for up to 6 to 12 months after improvement, or for up to two years in

people at risk of relapse, but many people take antidepressants for much longer. Surveys of antidepressant users suggest that up to a half of people on long-term antidepressant prescriptions have no clear medical reason to keep taking them. Long-term use can put people at risk of adverse events such as sleep disturbance, weight gain, sexual dysfunction, bleeding, and gastrointestinal problems, as well as feeling emotionally numb and unable to deal with problems in life without their medication. In this new study researchers looked at the findings from 33 randomized control trials that included 4,995 participants who were prescribed antidepressants for 24 weeks or longer. In 13 studies, the antidepressant was stopped abruptly; in 18, it was stopped over a few weeks (known as 'tapering'); in four, psychological therapy support was also offered. Most tapering schemes lasted four weeks or less and none of the studies used very slow tapering schemes beyond a few weeks — in contrast to guidelines.

Widely used medications for benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH) — also known as enlarged prostate — may be associated with a small, but significant increase in the probability of developing heart failure, suggests a study in *The Journal of Urology*, official journal of the American Urological Association (AUA). The risk is highest in men taking a type of BPH medication called alpha-blockers (ABs), rather than a different type called 5-alpha reductase inhibitors (5-ARIs).

Fire consumes New Boston home, no injuries

A home in New Boston is a total loss after a fire broke out on Saturday afternoon. Crews responded to the home on River Road shortly after 2:30 p.m. and were met by flames and heavy smoke. The New Boston Fire Department said the initial efforts were hampered by live wires down in front of the home, and water was put on nearby structures to prevent fire spread while it was waiting for the power to be shut off in the area. No one was home at the time, but a few firefighters suffered minor burns trying to contain the flames. "Bad that they lost the house but nobody got hurt seriously so we're happy with the results. We're happy with all our mutual aid towns that just supported us amazingly," said New Boston Fire Chief Dan MacDonald. The fire department said a rabbit was rescued and brought to the Manchester Animal Hospital. The cause of the fire is under investigation.


Hopkinton students to compete in National Young Inventors program
