### **Drag Racing Legend Dies**

#### Weare's Rodalyn Knox also excelled in Tractor Pulling

The world lost a pioneer in women's



sports when Rodalyn Knox died peacefully on July 2, 2022, while holding hands with her husband and high school sweetheart, John Knox.

Rodalyn is most

widely known for her drag racing and tractor-pulling career as "The Country Girl." In 1968, she began driving a Plymouth Hemi Super Stock car in the Powder Puff women-only class at New England Dragway, while husband John raced against the men for prize money. Eventually, John realized that Rodalyn was both quicker and faster than he was. He decided that it was better to "win than drive," and urged her to compete directly against the men. This decision was not without controversy at the time, and Rodalyn had to battle sexism and negative stereotypes against women in motor sports

throughout her career. Early on, a particularly aggressive male competitor asked her before a race if she should be home "making cookies." She responded by winning the race and taunting her defeated competitor, suggesting that he should go home and practice his baking skills. For the record, family members have reported that her cookies were, in fact, delicious.

Over the next 11 years, Rodalyn worked her way up from Super Stock to nitro funny cars. She took an extended break from the rigors of drag racing, and returned in 1990 to join husband John and son Brian in Unlimited Modified tractor pulling. Throughout the 1990s, the Knox family formed one of the most successful teams in tractor-pulling history. Rodalyn won Rookie of the Year in 1990, and went on to win three national championships in 1995, 1997, and 1998. She was inducted into the National Tractor Pullers Association Hall of Fame in 2008, as the only female competitor so honored.

### New London Select Board hears residents' concerns over speeding

Residents concerned about what they see as too many vehicles disobeying the speed limits or with speed limits that are too high and should be lowered, met with the Selectmen on Thursday, July 14th to discuss ways to address the issue. They point to the dangers of pedestrians walking near motorists who are driving at high speeds and the dangers to other motorists who are trying to safely make turns or leave their driveways as areas of concerns.

Residents of Bunker Road, Little Sunapee Road and Westside Drive previously met with the Town Administrator, Police Chief and Public Works Director to discuss the problem and potential solutions which have included enhanced police patrols, a public awareness campaign asking motorists to slow down ("obey the sign or pay the fine") and the use of the town's radar speed sign. Public Works Director Bob Harrington is working with the State DOT to install

a crosswalk at Bucklin Beach that will enhance the safety of pedestrians going to the beach. A resident purchased and installed signs along Bunker and Hall Farm roads asking people to slow down; it is not clear who removed many of the signs shortly after they were placed on the roadways. Residents feel that the measures taken so far have not been effective and they will ask the Selectmen to consider additional steps.



The Rotary Club of New London accepted the NexTrex challenge to recycle plastic number two and number four bags. After five months, the Club gathered 500 pounds of recycled plastic and shipped that plastic to the NexTrex facility in Maine. For that effort, NexTrex provided the club with an attractive park bench. Janet Kidder (I) a member of the board of selectmen and Judy Sheon (r) president of the Rotary are seated on the bench. Later this summer, the town will determine a suitable location for the bench.

### Major mixed-use development proposed for Antrim Mill buildings

The Antrim Planning Board recently conducted a Public Hearing on Antrim Commons' plan to develop 36 residential apartments, consisting of studio, one and two bedroom units plus a 20,000 sq. ft. commercial complex at the mill buildings on 42 Main Street.

Developer Zander Kemp would include the Grapevine's Teen Center and a new restaurant. He stressed that the project needed to be fully approved by August 9th in order to qualify for the state's new workforce housing funding.

The Board voted to accept the submission as "complete" despite missing several minor details on the plane and still needing the ZBA to approve with variances. The project also needs a federal wetland waiver.

25% of the residential units would be rented at market rates, while 50% would be eligible for a 60% rate and 25% for a 30% rate.

Police Chief Brian Lord and Fire

Chief reminded the Board that an increase in population would necessitate increased calls for service.

Much of the discussion revolved around parking, including the expansion to 40 parking spaces across Route 202. New sidewalks and signage would be necessary for pedestrian safety.

Eventually the meeting was adjourned to July 14th to allow the ZBA to hold its hearing on the 12th and allow the applicant to provide the missing information.

## FEW PATIENTS REGRET HAVING A SEVERELY DAMAGED TOOTH SAVED BY A ROOT CANAL FILLING



A new study shows that 87 percent would choose the same treatment again, if in need, although pain and discomfort around the tooth are common.

The reason for getting a root filling is often that the soft tissue inside the tooth, the dental pulp, is inflamed or infected. The root canal treatment is carried out in stages, on several occasions. Soft parts are removed and the root canals are finally filled with a

combination of a natural, rubberlike material (gutta-percha) and a kind of cement.

Despite generally good oral health, root canal treatment is still a common and necessary measure. In Sweden, as in most countries, most root canal treatments are performed by general dental practitioners in the public or private sector.

Most of the root canal treatments studied were prompted by toothache in teeth with caries and large restorations, which culminated in root fillings within a year. Molars were an exception: only just over half of the root fillings met their purpose and, as a result, many molars had to be removed (i.e. extracted).

Root canal treatments of molars involve significantly bigger challenges than other tooth groups. So it may be important to investigate whether root canal treatments of molars should be performed to a greater extent by dentists specializing in root canal treatment.

Half of the patients stated that they had mild pain or discomfort from their root-filled tooth during the follow-up period of up to three years. Nevertheless, the great majority (87 percent) were satisfied. They did not regret their choice to get root canal treatment instead of a tooth extraction.


Half of pregnant women who had a simple blood test to check their iron stores had low iron levels, and one in four had severe iron deficiency, according to a paper published in the journal *Blood Advances*. But despite how common iron deficiency is, 40% of pregnant women in this large regional study never had their iron levels checked, and women of lower socioeconomic status were less likely to get tested. Iron requirements in pregnancy are high to support the developing fotus the pregnancy are high to support the

port the developing fetus, the growing placenta, and the increased blood supply needed to sustain the pregnancy. This demand for iron increases over the course of pregnancy. Iron deficiency is the most common cause of anemia during pregnancy, which has been linked to poorer outcomes for both mother and baby, including a higher risk of premature delivery, low birth weight, post-partum depression, and even maternal death. Anemia early in pregnancy has also been associated with neurodevelopmental delays in the offspring, even as the child approaches school age and beyond, which points to potentially long-lasting effects. Even low levels of iron alone can cause pregnant women to experience fatigue, weakness, and brain fog.

Researchers have announced in a study published in *The Lancet Diabetes & Endocrinology* successful results of a clinical trial for a commonly prescribed weight-loss drug called liraglutide. In adults who are overweight or have obesity combined with high cardiovascular risk, once-daily liraglutide combined with lifestyle interventions significantly lowered two types of fat that have been associated with risk to heart health: visceral fat and ectopic fat. Visceral fat is stored within the abdominal cavity around important internal organs, such as the liver, pancreas, and intestines. Ectopic fat is stored in tissues that normally contain small amounts of fat, such as the liver, skeletal muscle, heart, and pancreas. According to the researchers, obesity affects an estimated 1 in every 4 adults and 1 in every 5 youths, leading to substantial risk of cardiovascular disease and mortality.

#### **Greenfield woman arrested for hotel robbery**

Melody Haggerty, 29, of Greenfield, faces an accom-



plice count while her boyfriend, Elias Dawley, also of Greenfield, is wanted for robbing the Double Tree by Hilton in February. Police were sent to the Double Tree by Hilton to investigate a robbery. A man showed a note to an employee demanding money, and fled with about \$800. Officers learned Haggerty had been fired recently from the

hotel. A management employee accused her of having knowledge of the front desk operations. She was picked up in a truck near Somerset Parkway. During a search for information on Haggerty, Elias Dawley, 28, was found to be her boyfriend. Haggerty denied any knowledge of a robbery but admitted to dropping Elias off across the street from the Double Tree, believing he was going to the location to purchase drugs. Arrest warrants were issued for Dawley, on a felony robbery charge, as well as Haggerty for felony criminal liability for the conduct of another-robbery. Haggerty was held on \$2,500 cash bail and was arraigned in Hillsborough Superior Court South Wednesday. She was released on personal recognizance bail and is due back in court for a dispositional conference on September 14. Haggerty faces seven years in prison and fines if convicted.

#### Franklin woman charged with meth possession

Hillary Riel, 33, of Franklin was indicted on a felony possession of methamphetamine charge on March 6 in Concord.

#### Hillsboro man arrested for meth possession

Michael Robinson, 31, of Hillsboro has been indicted on two counts of felon in possession-knives and felony possession of fentanyl-subsequent charges, all felonies. He was accused of possessing the drug and weapons in Bow on November 18, 2021.

#### Weare woman arrested on several charges

Samantha M. MacDonald, 33, of Weare was arrested on June 22 on driving after revocation or suspension, reckless operation, and breach of bail charges. She was arrested after an incident in Concord.

#### Bennington man charged with DWI crash

A Bennington man was charged with DWI following a car accident in Wilton June 2 that left 1,550 people without power. Frank C. Woodward, 73, of Bennington swerved off Forest Road on Route 31 and hit a utility pole which broke in half. Woodward was taken to a hospital in Nashua, where he was treated and released. His 2012 Toyota Tacoma was a total loss. Woodward is set to appear July 18 at the Milford District Court.

### Major renovations to begin on New London's Whipple Town Hall

New London's historic 1918 Whipple Memorial Town Hall will undergo renovations that will make it more comfortable for 21st century users of the facility. Town Meeting voters approved the appropriation of \$600,000 for upgrades that include tables and chairs, improved lighting, HVAC improvements that may include air conditioning, and sprinklers. These improvements will compliment the addition of audio-visual equipment, acoustic tiles and window shades that were recently added to the facility. The Whipple Hall 2022 Project Committee, Phil Sherman, Rip Cross, Colin Beasley and Nancy Rollins will be working with Frank Anzalone to prepare a scope for the project to present to the Selectmen for discussion and approval. The committee will also be supported by town staff who use and maintain the building. It is expected that the building will be closed once construction begins so that work can proceed in the most efficient manner.

The estimate at this point is Spring/ Summer 2023, but more will be known once the project scope is established. Once this work is completed, Whipple Hall will be available for the many meetings and activities held by the various boards and committees in town as well as non-profit groups that need space to offer a wide variety of cultural, educational and entertaining programming to the citizens of New London.
