

The list of talented artisans includes two League of NH Craftsmen juried members - Erica Walker Jewelry and Monica Rico of Wood Thrush Farm.


This event will feature a live music performance by Henniker's own Beechwood. Taco Beyondo's food truck will be onsite.



# Fire Danger Remains High



Firefighters from multiple New Hampshire departments battled a 2-acre brush fire in Hopkinton on Sunday that left no one injured. The Hopkinton Fire Department said it received a 911 call from a homeowner on Moran Road around 3 p.m. after the homeowner spotted a brush fire in the distance. Hopkinton Fire Chief Jeffrey Yale said the brush fire escalated to a third alarm. Yale said the fire was eventually put out, and crews planned to revisit the area on Monday morning to make sure no hotspots were still burning. He is reminding the public to not do any outside burning amid high fire danger. "It's an extremely dangerous fall to be burning," Yale said. "We are just trying to mop up what we have." Officials said they are investigating what caused the brush fire.



Saturday evening at approximately 18:36 our crew from B shift was toned mutual aid to the town of Goffstown on Silver Ln. for a 2nd alarm building fire, later growing to a 3rd alarm due to the fire extending into the woods. Weare Tanker 1 responded and provided companies on scene with water and manpower. Upon being cleared from the scene by command at 21:17 Weare Tanker 1 was rerouted to a 1st alarm brush assignment on Monarch Ave in the town of Goffstown to again provide companies on scene with water and manpower. We wish to express a sincere thanks to our mutual partners as we greatly enjoy working with our neighbors regardless of what help they need!



# Gale reports on Antrim's Emergency Management & Ambulance Budgets

Antrim Fire Chief Marshall Gale, who also serves as head of the Emergency Management Department reported that the proposed budget for 2025 will remain flat. 2024 was a quiet year for emergency management compared to 2023. 2023 had three significant rain events and two wind events that impacted our area.

Antrim hosted a NH Homeland Security class at the central fire station which was attended by Antrim personnel as well as several of our neighboring towns. Through the NH Emergency Operations Center we have the ability in real time to communicate with them during events. We can get updated information, advise them of current conditions and situations in Antrim, as well as request resources to mitigate an event. There are also grant opportunities to explore in the future to enhance our emergency management capabilities.

In 2023 Antrim ambulance responded to 460 911 calls.

This included 250 transports to hospitals and 210 non-transports. We receive no revenue from non-transports, but still incur operational costs to the service.

Currently the ambulance revolving fund is very solvent from being frugal with searching out vendors for the best value in equipment and supplies as well as accurate documentation on medical reports for insurance payments. We still operate 100% with no taxpayer funding from the town of Antrim. In the future with reductions in revenues from insurance companies, some funding from taxation may be needed to operate the service. Actual revenues received from allowed amounts for billing are between 55-69%. Non-transports, which includes lift assists, need to be accounted for as well because there still are personnel and vehicle costs incurred and they cannot be billed at this time. We are also exploring the option that if we treat on scene and the patient

refuses transport that we can still bill a set fee.

The second lease payments for the new ambulance of \$66,623.60 is due in December 2024. There are five total payments at an APR of 4.55%. There is an increase in the payroll line item for wage adjustments to get us in line with recommended federal pay scales for EMS. Crew night staffing has been working well and total

calls for service in 2023 was 460. We also must start planning the replacement of our cardiac monitors, as the current ones are reaching 10 years of age. In 2015, the cost for a 2011 X Series monitor was \$26,000.00. We anticipate that the future cost for replacement will be in the \$40,000.00 range per monitor.

As soon as the 2022 ambulance is paid off, 2014 will be due

for replacement. With a very volatile market and significant cost increases, this may be the time to consider having the existing box refurbished and placed on a new chassis to cut costs.

We are proposing a 3.03% increase for operating in 2025 with increases in wages, dispatch services, oxygen, equipment, billing service fees, and Medic intercepts.

# TAKE YOUR MEDICINE



A new study links increased use of acetaminophen during pregnancy — particularly in the second trimester — to modest but noticeable increases in problems with attention and behavior in 2-, 3- and 4-year-olds. The study adds to a growing body of evidence linking the frequent use of acetaminophen in pregnancy to developmental problems in offspring. The findings are detailed in the journal Neurotoxicology and Teratology.

More recent medications for Type 2 diabetes and weight loss shown to have positive effects on cardiovascular and kidney health were not always prescribed or accessible to people who could benefit from them. Trends in how these medications have been prescribed and provided to patients are the focus of three studies presented at the American Heart Association's Epidemiology Scientific Sessions 2024. The meeting offers the latest science on population-based health and wellness and implications for lifestyle. Sodiumglucose cotransporter-2 inhibitors, or SGLT2 inhibitors, are medications that lower blood sugar in adults with Type 2 diabetes. The medications have been proven to help reduce heart failure hospitalizations, recurrent cardiovascular events and chronic kidney disease progression, and are FDA-approved for people with Type 2 diabetes, chronic kidney disease and heart failure. More recent pharmaceutical treatments for both Type 2 diabetes and weight loss include liraglutide and semaglutide (glucagon-like peptide-1 receptor agonists, GLP1-RA), plus tirzepatide, which is a dual GLP1/glucose-dependent insulinotropic polypeptide receptor agonist (GIP-RA). All three medications are effective for people with Type 2 diabetes for lowering blood glucose levels and have been recently approved by the FDA for weight loss in people with obesity. They work with hormones within the body with effects on multiple organs, including causing food to move more slowly through from the stomach to the small intestine, leading to longer periods of feeling full and less hungry, and losing weight.

# **WHY SUGAR HURTS**

Sugar is an enemy to your teeth because when it combines with the filmy plaque that coats your teeth, it creates the acid that can erode enamel and begin tooth decay. Depending on any number of factors, the plaque can remain acidic for up to an hour. After that time, the plaque will begin to return to neutral and the danger will pass.

How you consume sugar also is central to how much damage it will do to your teeth. The amount of sugar you consume may, in the long run, be less significant than the way you consume it. Dessert at the end of a meal, say, followed by a brushing and flossing, minimizes the exposure of teeth to sugar. Consuming sugary products throughout the day, however, can keep your teeth in a bath of sugar. Sucking on a slow-dissolving hard candy, for instance, keeps your teeth in long contact with acid.

Sugary drinks like soda are equally damaging. Some items that you might think are healthy substitutes for sugar, like molasses, honey or corn syrup, may actually be more damaging because they are sticky and cling more easily to teeth than does refined sugar. Aside from its affect on teeth, sugar consumption contributes to a variety of human health problems, including obesity.


Following the show, students have a week of hands-on work-shops and improv sessions with Robot Teammate members.

# New England College Goalkeeper named Conference Goalkeeper of the Year

Junior goalkeeper Makenzie Anderson of Antrim, a ConVal High School graduate, has been named the Great Northeast Athletic Conference (GNAC) Goalkeeper of the Year for the 2024 season.

The honor was determined by a vote of conference coaches. Anderson helped New England College secure the No. 2 seed in the GNAC tournament with a 15-3 regular season record, including a 10-2 mark in conference play.

She was recognized as GNAC

Goalkeeper of the Week twice this season (Sept. 15, Nov. 3).

Anderson set career bests in save percentage, goals-against average and wins. Her .849 save percentage was the highest in the GNAC, surpassing the second-best mark by .034, and ranked seventh nationally in Division III. She exceeded her previous career high in save percentage by 50 points.

Anderson's 0.77 goals-against average was also a personal best, leading all qualified players in the conference and ranking

11th nationally in Division III. Her 16 wins tied a school record last achieved in 2008, and she finished the season with five shutouts.

"Mak consistently showcased her superior shot-stopping abili-

ties, exemplary decision-making, and a strong presence in the circle throughout the 2024 season," head coach Carly Sweeney stated. "She excelled in making crucial saves under pressure and highly contributed to the overall

success of the team's defense by continuously communicating effectively with her teammates. As a team, we are so proud to have the Goalkeeper of the Year honor bestowed on one of our very own."





### Illuminate your world

My sister, Norma sent me this recently and I felt it appropriate for this Holiday Season. LDB

"Some years ago, I was stuck on a crosstown bus in New York City during rush hour. Traffic was barely moving. The bus was filled with cold, tired people who were deeply irritated with one another, with the world itself. Two men barked at each other about a shove that might or might not have been intentional. A pregnant woman got on, and nobody offered her a seat. Rage was in the air; no mercy would be found here.

But as the bus approached Seventh Avenue, the driver got on the intercom. "Folks," he said, "I know you have had a rough day and you are frustrated. I can't do anything about the weather or traffic, but here is what I can do. As each one of you gets off the bus, I will reach out my hand to you. As you walk by, drop your troubles into the palm of my hand, okay? Don't take your problems home to your families tonight, just leave them with me. My route goes right by the Hudson River, and when I drive by there later, I will open the window and throw your troubles in the water."

It was as if a spell had lifted. Everyone burst out laughing. Faces gleamed with surprised delight. People who had been pretending for the past hour not to notice each other's existence were suddenly grinning at each other like, is this guy serious?

Oh, he was serious.

At the next stop, just as promised, the driver reached out his hand, palm up, and waited. One by one, all the exiting commuters placed their hand just above his and mimed the gesture of dropping something into his palm. Some people laughed as they did this, some teared up but everyone did it.

The driver repeated the same lovely ritual at the next stop, too. And the next. All the way to the river.

We live in a hard world, my friends. Sometimes it is extra difficult to be a human being. Sometimes you have a bad day. Sometimes you have a bad day that lasts for several years. You struggle and fail. You lose jobs, money, friends, faith, and love. You witness horrible events unfolding in the news, and you become fearful and withdrawn. There are times when everything seems cloaked in darkness. You long for the light but don't know where to find it.

But what if you are the light? What if you are the very agent of illumination that a dark situation begs for? That's what this bus driver taught me, that anyone can be the light, at any moment. This guy wasn't some big power player. He wasn't a spiritual leader. He wasn't some media-savvy influencer. He was a bus driver, one of society's most invisible workers. But he possessed real power, and he used it beautifully for our benefit.

When life feels especially grim, or when I feel particularly powerless in the face of the world's troubles, I think of this man and ask myself, What can I do, right now, to be the light? 


# **Area Choir to perform three Holiday Concerts**
