Copadis honored as a Community Builder

A tireless volunteer on multiple committees & commissions for five decades

The Masons of Harmony Lodge #38 in Hillsborough convened on Sunday November 23rd to honor their veterans and special ladies (widows of deceased members).

The highlight of the afternoon was the presentation of the 2024 Community Builders Award to Thomas Copadis, the unofficial Mayor of Deering.

After moving to Deering in the 1970's, Tom became active on various boards and committees, serving in nearly all capaci-

ties in the Town.

Over the years, Tom has served as a Trustee of Trust Funds (25 years), Cemetery Trustee (25 years), Conservation Commission (5 years), Planning Board (10 years), Ballot Clerk (19 years), Assistant Moderator (24 years), and Deputy Treasurer.

In total, Tom has devoted well over 100 years of service to Deering. When questions come up about how department systems were set up or are intended

to operate, Tom is always happy to provide an important and detailed historical perspective. With his long tenure and breadth of experience, Tom has come to be known as one of our most valuable Town Historians. In a town that thrives only with the support of volunteers, Tom Copadis stands out as one of the most active and dedicated volunteers in Deering's history. It is with great honor and affection that we present him with this Community Builder Award.

Vermont man crashes into NH State Trooper on I-89

On Thursday, November 28th State Troopers assigned to the Troop D barracks responded to a multitude of weather-related calls resulting from the Thanksgiving day snowstorm. There were dozens of reports of crashes and vehicles off the road on Interstate 89, mostly concentrated in the stretch between Warner and Lebanon.

A Trooper responded to assist the driver of a vehicle that had gone off the

road on I-89 southbound in Sutton. As the Trooper was in the right break down lane assisting the driver who had gone off the road, a 2009 black Honda Accord, whose driver was traveling at speeds excessive for the existing road conditions, slid on the snow and slush and struck the rear of the State Police cruiser. The vehicle, unable to stop, then slid into the pickup truck of a fire chief who had responded to the initial crash scene. The

Trooper and driver of the Accord were evaluated at New London Hospital for minor injuries.

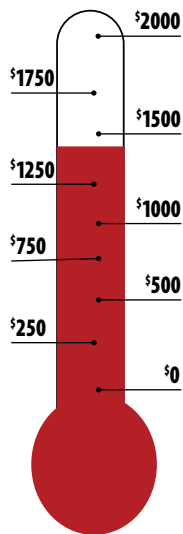
The driver of the Honda Accord was identified as Daniel Poroj, 22, of Shelburne, Vermont, who was summonsed on charges of operating without a valid license, negligent driving, unregistered vehicle, duty when approaching a highway emergency (Move Over law) and speed too fast for existing road conditions.

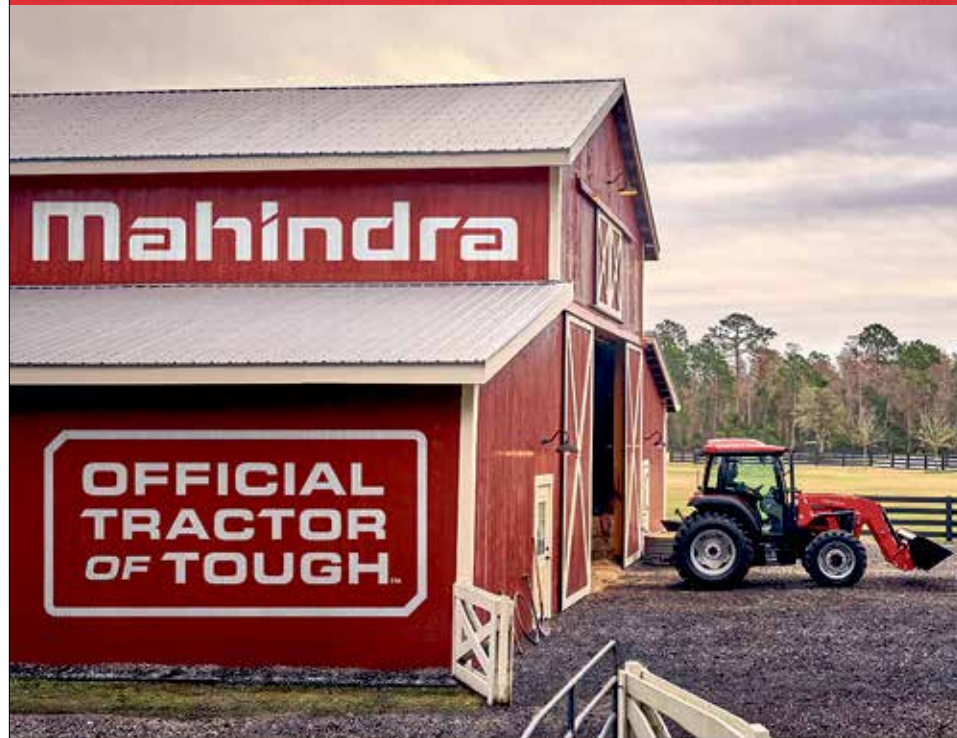

Pair of Hillsborough buildings destined for the wrecking ball

The Hillsborough Select Board dealt with a series of defective buildings recently. Town Administrator Laura Buono reported that the town was approved for a \$250,000 Demolition Grant for the Associated Electric buildings on West Main Street. The Board is considering utilizing this former Brownfield site for a new municipal office complex.

The building inspector sent Ms. Buono an update on the problems at the William Street apartment complex. The laundry room, duct work and mold repair is underway, outside first floor deck landing in the rear is being repaired, as well as site work to mitigate the water/drainage.

Ms. Buono also reported the heating system had more gas

leaks at 61-63 West Main Street, the former Project Genesis building, were repaired. The question to the Board is, do they still want to keep that build-

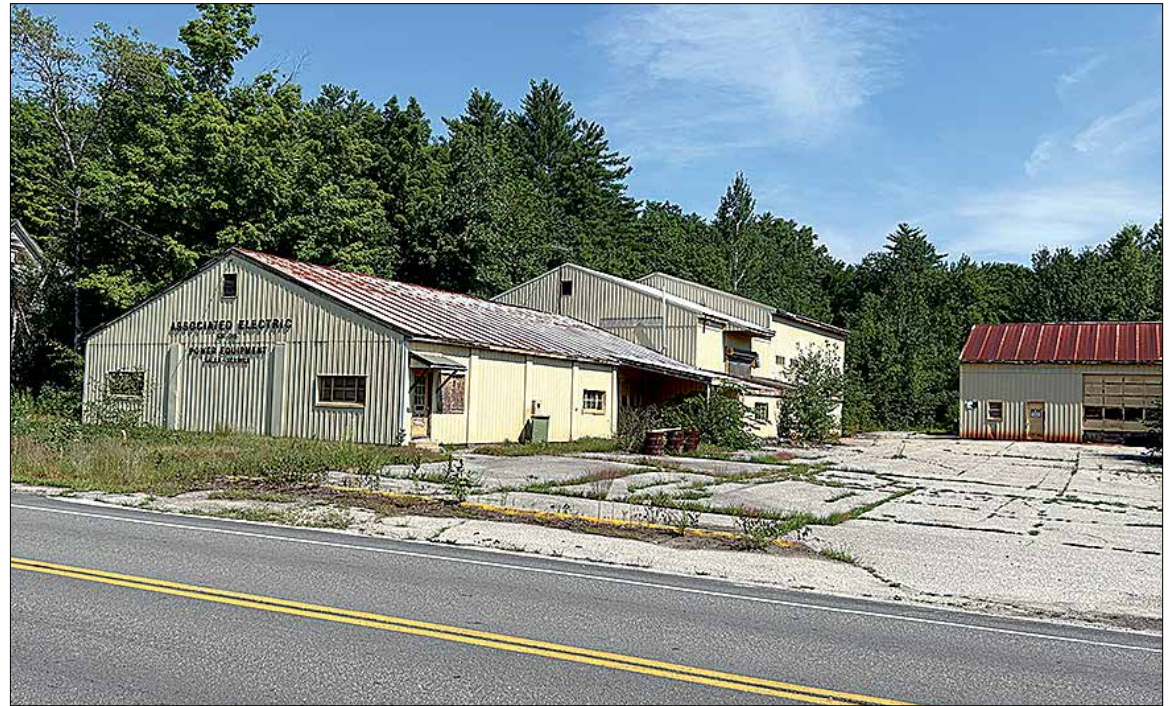
ing. Options were discussed. If decided to close or demolish the building the tenants will be notified well in advance.

Finally, it was also reported

that there are still some easements that need to be signed or reworked for the long awaited West Main Street Sidewalk Project.

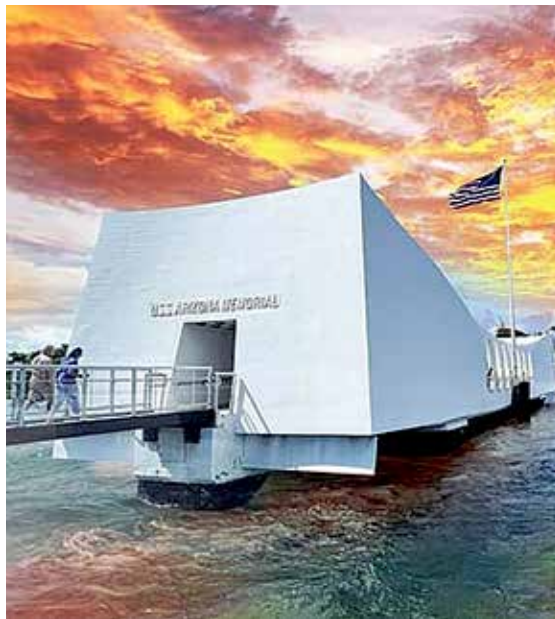

Violent arrest leaves two Hillsborough Police Officers hospitalized



On November 27, 2024, officers responded to Church Street in Hillsboro to arrest Michael Manley, age 46, of Hillsboro, on a warrant.

Upon making contact, Manley assaulted a female officer,

ultimately resulting in her being transported by ambulance to the hospital for treatment.

Manley then violently attacked a male officer who was left in a state of semiconsciousness on the ground.

That officer was also transported to the hospital by ambulance.

Two additional Hillsboro

officers on scene fired their tasers, which allowed officers to handcuff Manley. Although in handcuffs, Manley remained combative, assaulting a Deering Police officer before he was ultimately subdued and placed

in a cruiser.

Manley is currently being held at the Hillsborough County House of Correction, pending his arraignment scheduled for Friday.

Manley is charged with

2nd Degree Assault; Extreme Indifference; Resisting Arrest with Serious Bodily Injury; Resisting Arrest X2; Simple Assault on a Police Officer X3; and Endangering the Welfare of a Child.

Bow man faces DWI wrong way on I-93

A New Hampshire man is facing several charges after he allegedly drove the wrong way on Interstate 293 and Interstate 93 while intoxicated, officials said.

New Hampshire State Police said troopers arrested Brian Kunst, 49, of Bow on Sunday.

State Police said around 12:30 a.m. on Sunday, troopers received a report of a driver heading northbound in the southbound lanes on I-293 near mile marker 7.4 in Manchester. Officials said the driver continued northbound in the southbound lanes on I-93

in Hooksett. Later on, state police said it received a report of a crash involving one vehicle south of the Hooksett tolls. Officials said a driver swerved to avoid a head-on collision and went off the road. State police said the people involved in the single-vehicle crash sustained non-life-threatening injuries.

Officials said Kunst was eventually stopped by a state trooper on I-93 in Concord. He was charged with reckless conduct with a deadly weapon and driving while intoxicated.

TAKE YOUR MEDICINE

The use of the antipsychotic drugs quetiapine and halo peridol is associated with an increased risk of ventricular arrhythmias and sudden cardiac death (SCD) caused by drug-induced QT prolongation, reports a new study in *Heart Rhythm*. Caution is advised to manage cardiac risks in patients prescribed these medications, the authors of the study and an accompanying editorial say. The risks of cardiac conditions associated with the use of antipsychotics have been a concern for the last 30 years. Drugs have previously been either removed from the market or had their use restricted due to an unacceptably high risk of lethal ventricular arrhythmias. Drug-induced cardiac arrhythmias, however, remain an important clinical issue because there are drugs that increase the risk of SCD, but remain on the market because they serve an important clinical need and there are no safer alternatives.

In a meta-analysis of 5,000 participants, 8 multivitamins showed benefits for memory and global cognition.

Researchers, in a report published in *The American Journal of Medicine* on treating COVID symptoms with OTC, caution Acetaminophen is one of the most frequently used OTC drugs in the U.S. and worldwide as a treatment for fever, allergic symptoms, headaches, myalgia, symptoms of the common cold, and most recently COVID-19. Acetaminophen was originally marketed as an alternative to aspirin for treatment of mild to moderate pain based on reduced mucosal gastrointestinal side effects. The authors caution that even at daily doses of 4,000 milligrams per day, generally accepted as safe for adults, acetaminophen can be toxic to the liver and may result in the onset of acute liver failure. In the U.S., acetaminophen is the leading reason for calls to Poison Control Centers, with more than 100,000 cases per year. These circumstances account for more than 2,600 hospitalizations and 450 deaths in the U.S. due to acute liver failure.

WARNING ON ASPIRIN

Q: I'm on a low daily dosage of aspirin. Does this raise any dental concerns?

A: Indeed, many of us are on low daily doses of aspirin as part of high blood pressure treatment or because of a heart problem. That's because aspirin thins the blood. It is also a proven pain reliever and an anti-inflammatory agent. So, it is a safe, reliable piece of our medical kit.

We do, however, have to be careful with its use. One danger it poses on the medical front is the practice by some people of chewing aspirin. They may have a fear of trying to swallow a pill. Rather than waiting for a pill to dissolve in water, they'll pop it into their mouth and crush the pill with their teeth. That can severely damage tooth enamel. It can also harm the soft tissue of the mouth. Studies have found that a steady diet of that can significantly erode teeth.

Another dangerous practice is to pinch an aspirin tablet between cheek and gum as a treatment for a toothache. The acid in aspirin can literally burn the soft tissue. Since aspirin, as cited above, is a blood thinner, you want to make your dentist aware of the fact that you take it regularly. It may be a consideration if you are scheduled for any oral surgery.

Naturally, you should tell your dentist about any medications you take. Talk more with your dentist about the role of aspirin in your life.

Leading up to this change, residents and businesses of Greenfield who subscribe to a private alarm company for the purposes of fire or medical alarm monitoring should notify their company to change the telephone number used for reporting alarms.

Residents should also

learn the non-emergency public telephone number for the Milford Area Communications Center. The telephone number for fire alarm system reporting

is 603-673-3135. The non-emergency MACC telephone number is 603-673-1414. Questions regarding this change may be directed to Anderson at director

@macbase.org or LaCourse.

At 36, was elected the second Governor of Virginia succeeding Patrick Henry. At 40, served in Congress for two years. At 41, was the American minister to France and negotiated commercial treaties with European nations along with Ben Franklin and John Adams. At 46, served as the first Secretary of State under George Washington. At 53, served as Vice President and was elected president of the American Philosophical Society. At 55, drafted the Kentucky Resolutions and became the active head of Republican Party. At 57, was elected the third President of the United

States.

At 60, obtained the Louisiana Purchase doubling the nation's size.

At 61, was elected to a second term as President.

At 65, retired to Monticello.

At 80, helped President Monroe shape the Monroe Doctrine.

At 81, almost single-handedly created the University of Virginia and served as its first president.

At 83, died on the 50th anniversary of the Signing of the Declaration of Independence along with John Adams.

Thomas Jefferson studied the previous failed attempts at government. His voice from the past can lead us in the future, if we take time to listen. Here is some of what he had to say:

1. "When we get piled upon one another in large cities, as in Europe, we shall become as corrupt as Europe."
2. "The democracy will cease to exist when you take away from those who are willing to work and give to those who would not."
3. "It is incumbent on every generation to pay its own debts as it goes. A principle which if acted on would save one-half the wars of the world."
4. "I predict future happiness for Americans if they can prevent the government from wasting the labors of the people under the pretense of taking care of them."
5. "My reading of history convinces me that most bad government results from too much government."
6. "No free man shall ever be debarred the use of arms."
7. "The strongest reason for the people to retain the right to keep and bear arms is, as a last resort, to protect themselves against tyranny in government."
8. "The tree of liberty must be refreshed from time to time with the blood of patriots and tyrants."
9. "To compel a man to subsidize with his taxes the propagation of ideas which he disbelieves and abhors is sinful and tyrannical."

Jefferson was one of our first, and perhaps the greatest Democrat, but if he said these things today, he would be ostracized from his own party.
