## Weare's Naomi Bolton to retire



Weare Town Administrator Naomi Bolton announced her retirement, effective November 30, 2025, ending more than 30 years of public service to the town.

Her first job with the town was as part-time secretary for zoning and planning in February 1995. She took a full-time position as secretary in the highway department in November of that year and has served in multiple positions since that time, including 16 years as Town Administrator. Bolton's retirement follows her receiving two distinguished honors. The New England Chapter of the American Society for Public Administrators (NEASPA) presented her with the Robert H. McClain, Jr. Distinguished Public Administration Award "in recognition of her outstanding leadership and enduring commitment to public service." "Most notably," it continued, "Naomi was instrumental in the creation and establishment of the New Hampshire Women in Leadership Institute." Bolton also received the James W. Tethers Award from the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission.

## Philbrook named NH Teacher of the Year

*2026 Honoree teaches at Andover Elementary Middle School*

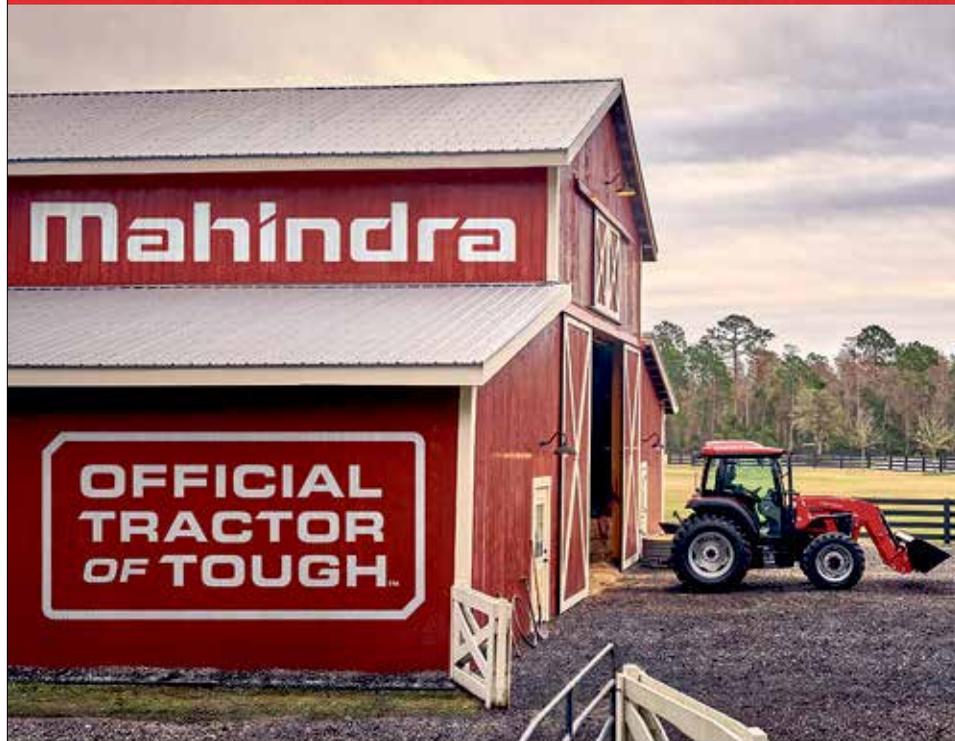
Megan Philbrook, a teacher at Andover Elementary Middle School, was named New Hampshire's 2026 Teacher of the Year during a surprise celebration last Thursday. Selected from a pool of 105 nominees, Philbrook was chosen for her ability to engage students in learning with curiosity and confidence, while also encouraging her students to take risks, embrace challenges, and believe in their ability to grow. Philbrook has taught for 11 years. Since 2017, she has worked as a social studies teacher at Andover Elementary Middle School.

Earlier in her career, Philbrook worked at The Moore Center with individuals with developmental disabilities, and Southside Middle School where she taught seventh-grade social studies. "New Hampshire's Teacher of the Year program recognizes some of the best educators throughout the state and the nation. We are honored to recognize Megan as our newest Teacher of the Year. Her enthusiasm for learning is contagious, according to those who know her best, and we are eager to celebrate her passion for education, her commitment to creative learning opportunities, and her efforts to make history come alive," said Commissioner Caitlin D. Davis. According to Principal Kelly George, Philbrook has shown incredible leadership both inside and outside of the classroom, earning the respect and admiration of her students and colleagues. "Her students are the ones who nominated her for this award. When I asked one of them

why he thinks she should win New Hampshire Teacher of the Year, he summed it up best when he said, 'Mrs. Philbrook is always upbeat, and she is very excited to teach, and that makes me excited to learn.'"

In her application essay, Philbrook wrote, "Whether it's inspiring new teachers or reigniting passion in veteran educators, I want to help all teachers find excessive amounts of joy in their teaching ... At the end of the day, to make learning magical isn't just for students – it's for teachers too," adding one of her goals will be to connect educators with underutilized resources such as grants, state-funded professional development, and local partnerships aimed at providing students with meaningful learning experiences. "Megan was selected as New Hampshire Teacher of the Year not only for her dedication and excellence in the classroom, but for the passion and creativity she brings every day to preparing her students to thrive as the workforce of tomorrow," said Joe Doiron, a member of the Teacher of the Year Selection Committee and Director of Workforce Development at the Department of Business and Economic Affairs. Christine Brennan, Deputy Commissioner of Education, agreed. "While we had a number of excellent nominees, Megan is a true champion for both students and educators. Her teaching style is unforgettable, and it is a privilege to honor her spark for leadership and teaching," said Brennan.

# Residents of Contoocook's Deer Meadow attempt to purchase the 60-unit park

The residents of Contoocook's Deer Meadow manufactured home park recently received a certified letter informing them that the Price family, owners of the 60-unit park, have put the land up for sale and received an offer from an out-of-state investor.

By law, the residents have 60 days to match the offer and buy the park themselves, as has been done dozens of times in New Hampshire already.


Two days before the August deadline, they made a \$6 million matching offer, hoping to gain ownership of the land they lived on. The Price family, however, rejected their bid, deciding to sell to the out-of-state investment firm, confirming residents' worst fears.

An attorney for the Price family wrote that it was not personal, it was a business decision. Nonetheless, residents can't understand why their offer was rejected.

State law gives residents the right to challenge the sale, and as most residents believe they weren't given a fair chance, they are bringing a suit against the Price family.

Under state law, housing park owners are required to "negotiate in good faith with the tenants" if an offer is submitted within the specified timeframe of 60 days.

If residents believe the park owner didn't negotiate in good faith, state law allows them to bring a penalty case, and if they win, the owner must pay the residents 10% of the park's purchase price. The Price family, who also owns Meadows of Hopkinton, another manufactured housing park in Contoocook, decided to put both properties up for sale in the summer. Sado Parks, a Michigan-based investment firm, submitted a \$12.8 million bid to purchase both parks, according to the purchase and sale agreement.




The Deer Meadow cooperative offered \$6 million for its 60 manufactured home lots, while the Meadows of Hopkinton cooperative put forward \$6.8

million for its 70 lots and a six-unit apartment building.

Although their offers were equal in value to Sado Parks' offer, there was a difference

in their terms: The residents' cooperatives would have needed a loan to make the purchase, while Sado Parks's purchase wouldn't depend on financing.

## TAKE YOUR MEDICINE

Meeting the minimum requirement for vitamin B12, needed to make DNA, red blood cells and nerve tissue, may not actually be enough — particularly if you are older. It may even put you at risk for cognitive impairment. A new study published in *Annals of Neurology* found that older, healthy volunteers, with lower concentrations of B12, but still in the normal range, showed signs of neurological and cognitive deficiency. These levels were associated with more damage to the brain's white matter — the nerve fibers that enable communication between areas of the brain — and test scores associated with slower cognitive and visual processing speeds, compared to those with higher B12.

A new study published in *JAMA Internal Medicine* found that statin use was associated with a reduced risk of hepatocellular carcinoma and hepatic decompensation in patients with chronic liver disease. These findings provide support for the potential role of statins in prevention of hepatocellular carcinoma and liver disease progression.

For children and teens living with migraine, there may be a new preventive treatment, according to a preliminary study presented at the American Academy of Neurology's Annual Meeting. Researchers found the drug zonisamide, which has been used to treat seizures, may reduce migraine days in this age group. This study does not prove that zonisamide reduces migraine days; it only shows an association. For all participants, the median number of headache days per month reduced from 18 to six at the first follow-up visit. The data also suggested that the drug was effective for both those with difficult-to-treat migraine disease and those without.

## STUDY PREDICTS NATIONAL FLUORIDE BAN WOULD SUBSTANTIALLY INCREASE CHILDREN'S TOOTH DECAY: PART I

Fluoride has been added to public water systems in the United States since 1945 to strengthen tooth enamel and fight off bacteria, ultimately reducing tooth decay. Mass General Brigham researchers developed a model to estimate dental health outcomes for children if the United States were to ban fluoridation of public water. The new study, published in *JAMA Health Forum*, found that banning fluoride would substantially increase dental decay and costs particularly for publicly insured and uninsured children.

"Fluoride replaces weaker ions within tooth enamel, making it stronger and less susceptible to tooth decay caused by bacteria," said senior author Lisa Simon MD, DMD, Division of General Internal Medicine at Brigham and Women's Hospital, a founding member of the Mass General Brigham health-care system. "There's strong evidence from other countries and cities, such as Calgary in Canada, showing that when fluoride is eliminated, dental disease increases. Our study offers a window into what would happen in the United States if water fluoridation ceased."

Simon and the research team focused on children for the study, because fluoride strengthens teeth during development, and more robust data links fluoridated water to oral health in this age group.

The study used detailed oral health and water fluoridation data collected from 8,484 children (ages 0-19, 49% girls) in the nationally representative National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey (NHANES). Using this dataset, the researchers developed a microsimulation model to see how banning fluoride from drinking water would impact oral health, quality of life and dental care costs.

# Antrim gathers to honor Christie Ellinwood's 64 years of service

A large crowd gathered Saturday, September 27th at Antrim's First Presbyterian Church to honor Christie Ellinwood's six decades of service to Maplewood Cemetery and the Antrim Historical Society.

State Rep. Jim Creighton (R-Antrim) read a proclamation from Gov. Kelly Ayotte, and Select Board member Bob Edwards read a statement from House Speaker Sherman Packard. The Maplewood Cemetery Trustees presented Ellinwood with a bronze plaque recognizing his 64 years of service to the town. "This plaque was given with sincere thanks for all Christie has done for Maplewood Cemetery and for more than 64 years of dedicated and unselfish service," said Select Board member Bob Edwards.


His sons, Christie S. Ellinwood, Jr. and Aaron Ellinwood recounted stories about their father, and Bill Nichols, president of the Antrim Histor-

ical Society, read a history of Ellinwood's life, starting with his birth in Keene in 1939.

Ellinwood began working at Maplewood Cemetery in 1957, at age 17.

According to the Antrim Historical Society, Maplewood Cemetery was founded in 1896 by Josiah Christie and Morris Christie, and Josiah Christie was the second person buried in Maplewood. Nichols said that Ellinwood has "always suspected" that he is descended from and named for the Christie family, but the connection was never confirmed. Nichols traced Ellinwood's long history in Antrim in his remarks.

"From those first days in Arthur Bryer's house on Gregg Lake Road to his years walking between his grandmother's house and the cemetery, Christie's life mapped itself onto Antrim's geography. He knew where the cellar holes were, which families had owned which farms,



why certain sections of the cemetery bore certain names," Nichols said.

Nichols lauded Ellinwood's long history of helping the Antrim Historical Society document the buildings, homes and families of Antrim, calling Ellinwood a "living archive."

"What makes Christie truly invaluable to the Antrim Historical Society is not just his personal story, but his role as a living repository of the town's collective memory. His brain holds what no archive can fully capture: the connections between

families, the stories behind the official records, the human details that bring dry historical facts to life. When researchers need to understand why certain sections of the cemetery bear particular names, or how families moved from farm to town, or which cellar holes belong to which homesteads, Christie is their go-to source.

"His generosity with this knowledge is remarkable. There is never hesitation when called upon, never a sense that his time is being imposed upon. Whether it is a question about lot numbers in the cemetery, the location of long-lost wells or fountains, or the intricate family connections that have shaped Antrim's social fabric for generations, Christie shares what he knows with the same gracious patience he showed during decades of cemetery work. His records, meticulously kept over the years, have become invaluable resources that complement and often correct

official documents.

"The Historical Society recognizes what they have in Christie—not just a member, but a treasure. His appointment as an honorary lifetime member is more than ceremonial recognition; it is an acknowledgment that some contributions transcend membership dues or committee work," Nichols said.

Christie has given something irreplaceable: a lifetime of careful observation, meticulous record-keeping, and most importantly, the willingness to share it all freely with anyone seeking to understand Antrim's past.

"In Christie, the Historical Society has found what every organization hopes for but rarely discovers: someone whose personal passion aligns perfectly with their mission, whose individual story illuminates the larger story they are trying to preserve. Christie, thank you for a wonderful 68 years," Nichols said in conclusion.

## Hillsborough man strikes pedestrian in Peterborough

A Peterborough woman was hospitalized Wednesday after being struck by a pickup truck at the intersection of Wilton Road (Route 101) and Grove Street (Route 202).

Peterborough Police and Fire & Rescue responded at about 4:55 p.m. and found a 2004 Chevrolet 2500 HD pickup truck in the center of the intersection. The pedestrian, identified as Nancy Salmon, 79, of Peterborough, was unresponsive and exhibiting agonal breathing.

Preliminary investigation and witness statements

indicated the truck, driven by Colin Gatlin, 22, of Hillsborough, was traveling westbound on Wilton Road and making a left turn onto Grove Street southbound with a green light when it struck Salmon, who was in the roadway.

First responders immediately began life-saving measures, and Salmon was transported to Elliot Hospital in Manchester. She was reported to be in stable condition with non-life-threatening injuries. The crash remains under investigation by Peterborough police.



## Three people dead after crash in Francestown

Three people are deceased following a crash into a telephone pole on Route 47.

At 11:10 p.m. on Tuesday, October 7, 2025, State Police dispatch received a report of a crash on Route 47 (Bennington Road) in Francestown. Troopers assigned to the Troop B barracks and emergency medical personnel responded.

The preliminary investigation at the scene determined that a 2013 Ford Focus had been traveling southbound on Route 47 when, for reasons which remain under investigation, it went off the right side of the road and crashed into a telephone pole. The Ford then continued along the shoulder before ultimately rolling onto its roof.

The three occupants within the Ford were thrown

from the vehicle and found to be deceased upon the arrival of first responders. They have been identified as Aiden Brissette, 19, of Bennington, Seth Fowler, age 19, and Luis Torres, 18, both of Antrim.

Route 47 was shut down for approximately five hours while utility crews attended to the downed wires, and Troopers documented the crash scene. The road reopened around 5:15 a.m.

Troopers were assisted at the scene by members of the Francestown Fire Department and Peterborough Fire & Rescue.

## Franklin man arrested for Criminal Threatening

On September 30th, officers from the Franklin Police Department responded to a report of a domestic disturbance at 104 Prospect Street.

Officers, with assistance from the Franklin Police Special Operations Unit, secured the scene and subsequently arrested Michael Carter, age 64, of Franklin, NH. Carter has been charged with Domestic Violence – Criminal Threatening (Felony).

Mr. Carter was arraigned on October 1, 2025, at the

Franklin Circuit Court and is currently being held on Preventive Detention. All individuals involved have been identified, and there is no ongoing threat to the public. The investigation remains active, and no additional details are available as of press time.

The Franklin Police Department commends the swift actions of the responding officers from Franklin, Andover PD, Northfield PD, Bristol PD, the Merrimack County Sheriff's Office, and NH State Police.

## Neal Kurk joins group challenging Federal request

Neal Kurk, of Weare, has joined a group of Granite State residents who are challenging the Trump administration's lawsuit seeking access to New Hampshire's statewide voter registration lists.

The lawsuit, filed in U.S. District Court in Concord by the U.S. Justice Department's Civil Rights Division, is on hold after federal prosecutors filed a motion requesting that Judge Andrea K. Johnstone indefinitely pause the case due to the federal government shutdown that took effect on September 30.

Former Rep. Neal Kurk, a 32-year veteran of the

NH House, decided not to run for reelection, but left a lasting legacy: a 19-word amendment that enshrined individual privacy rights in the state constitution.

"An individual's right to live free from governmental intrusion in private or personal information is natural, essential and inherent."

The privacy amendment achieved the necessary two-thirds majorities in both the House and Senate chambers by just one vote.

The question was passed overwhelmingly by voters in 2018, 81% to 19% statewide.

## Deer causes Route 202 accident Wednesday night

At about 9:25 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 1, a driver swerving to avoid a deer left the road, rolled, and struck a utility pole after crossing the northbound lane of Route 202 near the Peterborough-Hancock town line.

Police said the driver, Zachary Arruda, 23, of Jaffrey, was not injured. He was the sole occupant of the 2019 Toyota SUV, which was towed from the scene.

Eversource crews responded and replaced the damaged pole.



# Goffstown man arrested for negligent homicide

A 32-year-old Goffstown man has been denied bail on two felony counts of negligent homicide and one count of falsifying evidence after he refused New Hampshire's Implied Consent-mandated blood and alcohol tests after a crash on Sept. 20 left an Alton couple dead and another person in critical condition.

Anthony J. Summers, who is a paving foreman, allegedly drove his truck across the double-yellow line on Lake Shore Road in Gilford, plowing into Scott Blomerth, 67, and Robyn Blomerth, 59, of Alton, according to Laconia District Court documents.

The pair, who were riding motorcycles, died at the scene, police said.

A third man — a friend of the couple, Timothy "T.J." Sullivan, was taken to the hospital in critical condition. His condition was not available as of press time.

Summers's request for bail was denied by Judge Laura Lombardi in court on Wednesday. He is now being held in Belknap County Jail pending his indictment on the charges.

The third charge for falsifying evidence is a result of Summers's refusal to submit to drug or alcohol testing after the accident. According to reports, Summers threatened to sue officers if they attempted to test him for drugs or alcohol.

Under the state's Implied Consent law, RSA 265-A:4 states that to acquire a driver's license, motorists must agree to submit to breath, urine, or blood tests requested by law enforcement when stopped for a suspected DUI offense, so under the law, he had already agreed to take these tests.

According to court documents, police obtained a search warrant, but they were



refused by Summers. Drivers can legally refuse these tests, but doing so triggers automatic penalties. Refusing to submit to a breathalyzer leads to an immediate driver's license suspension of 180 days for first offenses and a maximum of two years for motorists with previous DUI convictions.

This occurs irrespective of whether the motorist receives a DUI conviction for the current incident.

But though Sullivan has a 2016 conviction for DUI — details of which were not specified in the court documents — prosecutors have no evidence that any alcohol was involved in this crash, said Summers's attorney, Alex Yiokarinis of Russman Law Offices in Portsmouth.

"What we know is he was driving in a vehicle and a crash happened," he said. "There is no evidence of alcohol (being a factor in the crash)."

Summers will put up a stout defense, Yiokarinis said on Friday.

"He absolutely intends on fighting this," he said.

# Andover Select Board agrees to lease a Freightliner six-wheel dump truck

The Andover Select Board met to discuss potential lease agreements for new highway department trucks. Options reviewed included:

Ford F-350 pickup truck (\$50,000 with plow and sand-er); Ford F-600 medium-duty truck (\$109,000, available for lease); Freightliner six-wheel dump truck (\$251,000, available for lease).

A used Western Star dump

truck was determined unsuitable due to poor condition.

The discussion included details on lease terms, payment schedules, financing options, and truck conditions.

The Board reviewed the F-250's ongoing mechanical issues and trade-in value (\$20,000-\$21,000).

Highway Supervisor Cornell emphasized the need for reliable equipment heading into winter

operations.

Funding sources discussed included lease financing, the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, and freed-up cash.


The Board voted to authorize the Town Administrator

to enter into a lease agreement with Fairfield for a Freightliner 114SD six-wheel dump truck, on a 60-month term with monthly payments of approximately \$4,740.
